The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty -two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.


Vehicle Accident

On December 21, 2018 at 8:00 a.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Route 8, at McCully Road, for a two-vehicle accident. Upon arrival, officers verified that there were no reported injuries. The accident occurred when one vehicle turned right off of Craighead Road to travel south on Route 8. The vehicle operator then attempted to change lanes to ultimately make a left onto McCully Road but collided with another

vehicle that was traveling south in the passing lane. One vehicle had to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage.

On January 9, 2019 at 3:34 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Route 8, at McCully Road, for a two-vehicle accident. The two involved vehicles were still in the roadway upon the officer's arrival. The accident occurred when one vehicle was stopped on Route 8, in the southbound passing



Police Log (Continued from page 3) lane, waiting to make a left turn onto McCully Road. A second vehicle then rearended the stopped vehicle, causing disabling damage. One vehicle had to be towed from the scene.

On January 12, 2019 at 6:10 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Middle Road, at Haberlein Road, for a two-vehicle accident. Both vehicles were found to be in the roadway upon the officer's arrival. The involved drivers reported that one operator was attempting to travel left off of Haberlein Road, onto Middle Road, when their vehicle spun 360 degrees and entered the opposite lane of travel, striking another vehicle. Both vehicles sustained moderate damage but were able to be driven from the scene.

On January 12, 2019 at 8:08 p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to West Hardies Road for a vehicle that had slid off of the roadway. The accident occurred during a period of poor weather conditions, which resulted in the roads being covered in snow and ice. Due to the position of the vehicle, which had slid over a small hillside, the fire department responded to the scene to assist in extricating the occupants of the vehicle. The involved vehicle was towed from the scene.

On January 14, 2019 at 7:03 a.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Route 8, near Harts Run Road, for a threevehicle accident. Upon the officer's arrival, the drivers of the vehicles stated that one vehicle had been fully stopped in the northbound passing lane of Route 8, waiting to turn left, when the accident occurred. A vehicle traveling two cars behind the stopped vehicle then rear ended the vehicle directly in front of it that was slowing down for the stopped vehicle ahead. The second involved vehicle was then pushed into the stopped vehicle as a result of getting rear-ended. All three vehicles were towed from the scene and two vehicle occupants were taken to the hospital by ambulance.

Vehicle Accident/DUI Arrest

On December 28, 2018 at 6:13 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to the intersection of Route 8 and West Hardies Road for a two-vehicle accident. Upon the officers arrival, they located both vehicles still in the roadway. The accident occurred when one vehicle rear ended the other while it was stopped at a steady red light. The operator of one vehicle

showed visible signs of impairment and was observed to be

unsteady on their feet. The operator failed to complete field sobriety tests as had been explained and demonstrated and was placed under arrest for suspicion of driving under the influence.

DUI Arrest

On December 16, 2018 at 3:01 a.m., Hampton Township officers were dispatched to Middle Road for a vehicle that had traveled off of the roadway and was parked in a front yard. Upon arrival, officers spoke to the vehicle operator, who showed visible signs of impairment. The operator was subsequently placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI following attempted field sobriety tests.

On December 21, 2018 at 3:41 p.m., Hampton officers were dispatched to Ferguson Road for a male who was observed to be slumped over the steering wheel of his car and appeared to be unresponsive. Upon the officer's arrival, they located the vehicle operator still slumped over the steering wheel. The first officer on scene was able to wake the operator, who showed signs of impairment. The officer also detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle. The






pionship team graduated in 2018.





They come out one at a time, walking with heads down, eyes averted from the climbing wall. This way, it is ensured that each climber will have to figure out their own way up the wall because they can't watch the person before them. The audience is not allowed to give advice or feedback.

When it is the competitor's turn, they will have four minutes to figure out how to climb the set route of rocks that span the twenty-foot wall. These routes are called "problems" and will become a test of the climber's problem-solving skills, strength, flexibility, and tenacity. Many times, a climber will visualize the route he is going to take up the wall before he actually begins to climb it. Fore-arm, bicep, and finger strength are key elements to success as some of the rocks on the wall are nearly as small as a

dime, and only twice as thick.

At the end of the competition, the climber who has made it the highest up the wall in the least number of attempts, will win. Because there are no ropes in Bouldering, sometimes the falls taken can be pretty hard. The public will get a better idea of this high -pressure, high intensity sport when it is unveiled in the 2020 Olympic Games.

At the Divisional competition in Richmond, Virginia on January 8th and 9th, two local climbing youths overcame this pressure and qualified to the Nationals, which will be held next month in Bend, Oregon.

Andre Marcais, a junior at Hampton who trains at Climb North, placed 4th over-all in the Youth A category, as did his 5th grade teammate from Fox Chapel, Gavin Youkers, in the Youth D category. With many teammates and friends cheering them on, Andre was



able to "flash," or "complete the route on his first attempt," his first two climbs and Gavin flashed his third and final climb. Those strong performances solidified their placement among the top six.

Their coaches, Justin Mech and Mylauna Swango are excited to be taking two climbers to the National competition because they understand just how difficult this is to accomplish.

"These boys train hard and deserve to make it to the next level. They were able to stay calm and use their strength and training to help them reach their goals," said Mech.
