#### **Police Log**

The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 1/15/2019—2/23/2019:

#### **Residential Fire**

On February 20, 2019 at 8:23 p.m., Hampton Township Police and Fire Departments responded to a house on Stella Drive for a structure fire. Upon their arrival, the homeowner advised that the dishwasher had gone up in flames and started the fire. The kitchen was fully involved upon their arrival, but the fire department was able to get the fire under control and extinguished.

On February 23, 2019 at 9:43 a.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Red Oak Court for a residential fire. Upon the officers' arrival, they found the rear of the residence to be engulfed in flames. Multiple fire departments responded to the scene and were able to extinguish the fire. Nobody was injured.

#### **Vehicle Accident**

On January 16, 2019 at 7:12 p.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Route 8, near South Pioneer Road, for a two-vehicle accident with unknown injuries. Upon arrival, one vehicle was located in a parking lot, and the other was located over a curb on the side of the road. Medics responded to the scene to evaluate one vehicle operator. The accident occurred when one driver was attempting to turn left onto Route 8 to head south from a parking lot. The operator failed to see an oncoming vehicle in the southbound passing lane, and the two vehicles collided. One vehicle had to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage.

#### Single Vehicle Accident/DUI Arrest

On January 25, 2019 at 7:31 p.m., Hampton Township Police responded to East Elfinwild Road for a single vehicle accident. Upon their arrival, officers located a vehicle facing north in the eastbound lane of travel.



They observed a damaged telephone pole that was nearly sheared in half as a result of the collision, so Duquesne Light Co. was notified of the damage. The operator and sole occupant stated that they were traveling eastbound, when they lost control of their vehicle, crossed the double yellow center line and struck the utility pole. The vehicle sustained disabling damage and was towed from the scene. The operator showed visible signs of impairment and the officer detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from their person. The operator submitted to field sobriety tests, which they were unable to complete as had been explained and demonstrated and was subsequently placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI.

On February 15, 2019 at 2:00 p.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Mount Royal Boulevard for a single vehicle accident. Upon the officer's arrival, they located a vehicle rolled onto the driver's side, along with a sheared utility pole. The operator of the vehicle was found to be out of the car already and was walking

around. Duquesne Light Co. responded to the scene to fix the affected utility pole and wires. While on scene, officers observed the male to be showing visible signs of impairment. The male was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI and was transported to the hospital by ambulance. The involved vehicle was towed from the scene.

#### Single Vehicle Accident Involving Tree

On February 11, 2019 at 8:40 p.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Harts Run Road for a single vehicle accident. Upon the officers arrival, they observed a vehicle with heavy front-end damage. The operator stated that they were traveling on Harts Run Road when they saw a flash of light, and then a large tree fell onto the front of the vehicle, bringing down power lines. The driver was not injured, but the vehicle did have to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage. Duquesne Light Co. also responded to the scene due to the affected wires.

#### **Single Vehicle Rollover Accident**

On January 25, 2019 at 8:30 a.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Ferguson Road for a single vehicle accident with unknown injuries. County dispatch advised responding officers that the involved vehicle had rolled over and that the operator was already out of the vehicle. Shaler Hampton EMS responded to the scene to evaluate the operator. The operator stated that they hit a patch of ice in the roadway, causing the vehicle to slide across the roadway. The operator attempted to correct the vehicle, but ultimately struck a hillside, which caused the vehicle to roll over onto it's roof. The vehicle was towed from the scene, and Hampton Township DPW responded to the scene to salt the roadway.

On January 29, 2019 at 12:47 a.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Sample Road, near Oak Lane, for a single vehicle rollover accident with possible entrapment. Upon their arrival, officers located the operator and sole occupant already outside of the overturned vehicle. The operator stated that they were traveling east on Sample Road through an "S" bend when they lost control on the slick roadway. The vehicle went into a hillside, which caused it to roll on its side. The driver denied any injuries at the time of the crash. The vehicle was towed from the scene due to extensive damage.



ill Cardone has been named the 2018 Pennsylvania Region 4 Athletic Director of the year from the Pennsylvania State Athletic Directors Association. Bill is the Athletic Director for the Hampton Township School District and he has served in that position for the past 19 years. He oversees athletics in both the high school and middle school as well as a number of club sports. He was a graduate of Hampton High School (1973) and Robert Morris University as well as a tri-athlete playing baseball, football, and basketball in school.



Each year, one athletic director is chosen from each of the five regions listed with the PSADA. Hampton Township is in Region 4, which includes District 7 and 8 of the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association. Cardone was nominated by fellow peers outside of the school district. 


scorer and rebounder was 6'5" junior Ben Ringeisen, who averaged a double/double of 18.5 points per game (ppg). Ben received a first team Big 56 all section honors for his accomplishments this season. Junior Colby Mignogna, 6'3", was the team's second leading scorer with 12 ppg. Colby was honored with second team Big 56 selection. Junior Luke Lindgren, 6'0", had 8 ppg and was the team's leader in assists with 4 per game and


steals with 3.6 per game. Sophomore Quinn Morrow, 5'9", was a significant contributor as a reserve and lettered this year.

Head coach Joe Lafko said the nucleus of the team will be back next year with three rising seniors, Ringeisen, Mignogna, and Lindgren. Lafko said, "Going into this season there were many question marks for this team. #### **Minutes With Mizgorski**

I recently had the opportunity to meet with State Representative Lori A. Mizgorski in her district office to talk about her first two months in office. Here are some highlights:

Representative Mizgorski introduced legislation that was unanimously passed by the PA House. House Bill 318 amends the 1996 Telemarketer Registration Act. The legislation gives consumers the ability to permanently sign up for the telemarketing PA "Do-Not-Call" list without having to re-register every 5 years. It also prohibits telemarketing on legal holidays. The legislation requires computerized autodialer calls (robocalls) to provide an opt-out option at the beginning of the call. "My bill also allows businesses to register on the PA "Do Not Call" list," explains Mizgorski. "This gives them the same protections from

nuisance telemarketing and robocalls as residents." The bill now moves to the state Senate for consideration.

Rep. Mizgorski is supporting other legislation to allow our local police forces access to Radar technology to enforce speed limits. Currently, Pennsylvania is the only state that does not allow municipal law enforcement to use radar. The state reserves the technology for state troopers only. Over the years serving as a Shaler Township Commissioner, Rep. Mizgorski heard countless resident complaints on drivers' speeding through neighborhoods and their requests for police action to deter speeding. Municipal police currently use VASCAR to determine speed. The primary weakness of VASCAR is that it can only provide an average speed, in contrast to the near-instant speed readout of a Doppler-effect system such as RADAR. Representa-(Continued on page 23)
