

Police Log

The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 1/20/2021—2/15/2021:

Vehicle Accident

On January 20, 2021 at 6:47 p.m., HTP responded to Wildwood Road for a vehicle accident. Upon the arrival of the responding officer, they located a vehicle blocking one lane of travel. The vehicle had struck a concrete barrier at the beginning of a bridge. The vehicle operator stated that the vehicle had slid on black ice and struck the barrier. The vehicle sustained disabling damage as a result of the crash and was towed from the scene.

On January 22, 2021 at 7:53 a.m., HTP responded to Route 8, at Talley Cavey Road , for a two vehicle accident. Upon arrival, officers observed two involved vehicles blocking both northbound lanes of travel. The vehicles both sustained substantial damage due to the collision and had to be towed from the scene. The accident was discovered to have occurred when one vehicle, which was traveling north in the curb lane of Route 8, failed to stop for a steady red traffic signal, and collided with another vehicle that was driving into the intersection from Talley Cavey Road.

On January 31, 2021 at 4:10 p.m., HTP were dispatched to West Hardies Road for a single vehicle crash that had reportedly caused a gas leak. Upon their arrival on scene, officers were advised that the vehicle in question had slid on icy roads

ized just how fortunate she was to be able to navigate the system, all thanks to a simple tip on her friend's Facebook page.

Sensing a community need, Leighann approached Heather to discuss how they might help people schedule vaccinations. Heather connected Leighann with Liz Huber of McCandless who was sharing vaccine tips on her own Facebook page.

"After seeing what Liz was doing," Leighann says, "I realized the best way to help might be to make a Facebook page where people could share tips about appointment openings in the area."

Soon, an unofficial partnership was forged and the "Getting Pittsburgh Vaccinated—COVID-19 Appointment Tip Page" was born, the brainchild of these three local women whose goal was to bring people in the area together in their search for 2021's version of the proverbial Golden Ticket: a COVID-19 vaccine and its promise of hope.

With group membership exploding, Leighann says, "It truly has become a second full-time job. We try to deliver information as quickly and accurately as possible, and we're gathering resources to enable people to navigate the system on their own. The group has evolved from a 'free-for-all' source of information to an organized 'hub' of information. I believe this model is the best way to get a lot of people vaccinated."

Heather is quick to point to Leighann as the hero of the group, declaring, "Leighann is a local humanitarian and, in my eyes, an inspiration, spearheading this group and recruiting helpers who are just as kind and generous with their time."

Championships took place at North Allegheny High School, with boys competing in AA and girls in AAA. Diving coach Keith Hart explained he was very confident in the kids' abilities going into the championships, and that he's extremely proud of how far the team has come in such an unpredictable season. Hart said, "I hope the kids enjoyed it, and did not put too much pressure on themselves. Instead of focusing on being first, they focused on improving their own personal goals. I'm so proud of the four of them, and the whole team for the amount of effort they've put in these last few months."

For junior Annalise Craig this year has been about improving mindset going into meets. "Although the nervousness was there, I'm putting less pressure on myself and stayed relaxed," Craig said. Koda, who is currently a sophomore, has had an extremely successful season, including breaking his school record, which he had previously broken freshman year. Carslaw explained, "This season has been my best by far; I feel like I've improved in every aspect of diving since last year. I felt very confident and was ready for WPIALS." Going into next season he hopes to be the first boy at Hampton with a score of over 300.

Mr. Hart emphasized that he's extremely grateful that practices and meets were able to go on safely, and the kids were able to find a healthy balance between fun and work.



However, this fate is not common enough with children battling blood cancers and I intend to make a difference." She further commented, "I've definitely received many kind words of encouragement, I learned many people's stories on blood cancer, and I've learned so much about reaching out and making proposals. Also, I would definitely love to help out future candidates because this experience has

been very fulfilling for sure."


