New Sunscreen Policy at Community Pool

The Township of Hampton's Louisa Rush Swimming Pool was renovated in 2000 and is located in the township community park. The pool is open annually from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day of each year. The 2019 operating budget for the pool is \$337,805, along with capital improvements of \$62,500, which includes a new roof for the concession stand, new diving boards, new pool shade structures and a new automated pool

Police Log

The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 3/17/2019— 4/13/2019:

Dumpster Fire

On March 13, 2019 at 4:03 p.m. Hampton Township Police responded to a business on Route 8 for a report of a dumpster fire. Upon arrival, the dumpster was fully engulfed, but was not posing any danger to the surrounding businesses. Members of the fire department responded to the scene and extinguished the fire.

Residential Fire

On April 2, 2019 at 4:04 a.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Sample Court for a report of a residential structure fire. Upon arrival, officers evacuated the nearby residences. 

On Sunday, April 22nd, 2018, several Hampton middle school boys received their Ad Altare Dei religious emblems at Saint Paul Cathedral in Oakland during the annual Scout Convocation. The Convocation is a Mass celebrated with a bishop and other clergy at St. Paul Cathedral, during which the religious awards/emblems that were earned by Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and Camp Fire members are blessed and distributed.

Boy Scout Mass (Continued from page 4) community. The program is organized in chapters based on the seven sacraments. The seven Sacraments are a primary means toward spiritual growth." It is one of the ways they can fulfill their Duty To God requirement. All religious emblems earned by the Scouts are formulated and administered by their own religious denomination.

Locally the program is administered by the Catholic Committee on Scouting (CCOS) of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, under the direction of the National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCOS). The award is worked on in small groups facilitated by counselors trained by the CCOS. The counselors for this emblem were myself (Karen Brienza, Chaplain, Troop 195) and Steve Mitterer (Committee Chair, Troop 195) and the award meetings were held at St Catherine of Sweden Church.

The Scouts had sixteen meetings at variable intervals from May 2018 until January 2019. The program includes a workbook, discussions, service projects, guests on dedicated topics (e.g. Deacon Cliff Homer answered the boys' questions about the sacrament of Holy Orders), and a retreat with Scouts from around the Diocese at the Annual Scout Retreat.

chemical monitor. The swimming pool averages approximately 36,000 users annually. In preparation of the 2019 swimming pool season, lifeguards have been trained in CPR, AED use, first aid and rescue techniques to make the pool an enjoyable experience and safe for all. Pool officials look forward to providing the best services to all pool users, so experience "community" within the Hampton community. Everyone is excited with the warmer weather, fresh paint, new chairs and a clean and safe pool for this year. As part of this year's preparations, staff responsibilities continue to be to provide the healthiest, cleanest and safest envi-



ronment possible for all pool patrons. Due to respiratory risks to patrons and staff and the negative effects it has on the pool circulation/filter system, the use of spray sunscreen has been banned from the interior fence area of the pool. Lotions are permitted inside the confines of the pool complex, but absolutely no sprays. A designated area will be provided for spraying sunscreen. Sample size sunscreen lotion will be available at the gate for a minimal fee. Please apply sunscreen 30 minutes prior to entering the pool water. Just as

and had to be towed from the scene. The accident occurred when one vehicle was traveling south on Route 8 and was stopped to turn left onto Anderson Drive. As the vehicle began to turn, it was struck from behind.

On March 7, 2019 at 1:16 a.m., Hampton Township Police responded to Duncan Avenue for a single vehicle that had driven into a hillside. The driver was reported to have sustained injuries and was bleeding. Upon the officer's arrival, they located a vehicle into a hillside with heavy front end and undercarriage damage. The operator had visible injuries and was transported to the hospital by ambulance. The operator stated that they were driving on Duncan Avenue when an animal ran in front of the vehicle, causing the driver to swerve and lose control of the vehicle.

On March 12, 2019 at 5:10 p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to Mount Royal Boulevard for a single vehicle accident involving a utility pole. The vehicle was reported to be smoking. Upon the officers' arrival, they located the vehicle in question resting against a telephone pole with heavy front end damage. The operator had sustained injuries during the crash, and medics responded to the scene. The operator had lost control of the vehicle around a bend in the roadway, struck a mailbox and then struck a telephone pole. The operator was transported to the hospital by ambulance and the vehicle had to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage.

On March 17, 2019 at 6:08 p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to West Hardies Road, at Oak Hill Road, for a two vehicle accident with entrapment. Upon the responding officers arrival, both vehicle operators were found to be out of their vehicles. The accident occurred when one vehicle was stopped in the east bound lane, waiting to turn left onto Oak Hill Road when the vehicle was rear-ended. Both vehicles sustained disabling damage and had to be towed from the scene. One operator was transported to the hospital by ambulance.

On March 27, 2019 at 5:33 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Route 8 and Oxford Boulevard for a multiple vehicle accident. Upon their arrival, officers located three involved vehicles. The accident occurred when the operator of one vehicle attempted to pull out of a business parking lot onto Route 8 and was rearended. This caused the vehicle to cross lanes and strike another vehicle. All three vehicles sustained disabling damage and had to be towed from the scene.




partially blocking East Bardonner Road, and had to be removed from the hillside by a tow truck.

Farmers/Vendors Needed for Farmers Market

The Township of Hampton is accepting applications from farmers and vendors for the Farmers Market which is scheduled to begin June 2019. Farm-fresh produce, homemade items, baked goods, and jams/jellies, are just some of the items as potential offerings.
