## **Keeping Hampton Beautiful**

The annual Hampton Community clean-up day was very well attended this year, with 110 volunteers showing up to help keep Hampton beautiful. The large group began work early on a cold April morning and collected 650 bags of garbage, 2 tires, and some miscellaneous items.

There has been an organized litter clean -up day since 2016 (2020 was missed because of the pandemic). Last year, there

was a record number of 135 volunteers and in prior years the average was 40-50 participants. Many Hampton residents volunteered and this year the Daisy Troup #16720 and the Hampton High School boys lacrosse team showed up to make a big impact. Twenty-eight lacrosse team members as well as varsity head coach Andy DeMichiei volunteered for the event. Lacrosse booster president, Erik Hoolahan came up with the idea for the team to

participate this year. Coach DeMichiei said, "I'm not sure they were thrilled to wake up at 7am on a Saturday, but once they got there and saw the impact of how much trash they actually picked up, they were all for helping out!" He added, "I was very happy about our boys' attitude towards serving our community. On top of coaching lacrosse, a large part of my job as head coach is teaching these boys how to

## **Police Information**

The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.

A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 3/7/2022—4/4/2022:

#### **Traffic Accident**

On March 9, 2022 at 8:10a.m., Hampton Township police were dispatched to the area of Woodland Road near Harts Run Road for a report of a disabled vehicle stuck due to icy road conditions. Upon arrival, multiple vehicles were stopped in the roadway due to the icy conditions in which two of the vehicles had collided. The accident occurred when one vehicle was sliding on ice and struck the back of a second vehicle. Both vehicles were able to be driven from the scene of the accident.

On March 11, 2022 at 10:42a.m., Hampton Township officers were dispatched to 4700 block of William Flinn Highway for a report of a two vehicle accident. Upon arrival, both vehicles were located in the parking lot of Firestone. The accident occurred as one vehicle was traveling southbound on William Flinn Highway in the left lane. The driver looked down at their phone, causing them to fail to see a stopped vehicle ahead. This distraction caused the operator to strike the rear of the other vehicle. Officers confirmed there were no injuries and both vehicles were able to drive away from the scene.

On March 13, 2022 at 6:00p.m., Hampton Township police were dispatched to the 4700 block of William Flinn Highway for a report of a hit and run accident. The driver stated they were exiting the Primanti Brother's parking lot to head northbound on William Flinn Highway. The driver then stated as they were exiting the parking lot, a vehicle crashed into the rear passenger door and quarter panel causing minor damage. The second

According to Pelkofer, every penny raised from the Pink Tag Sale goes to the charity; over the years more than \$80,000 was raised.

The Pink Tag Sale is Saturday, May  $7^{th}$  from 9:00 – 3:00 at the BHHS Hampton office, and is open to the public.

Office manager, Patrick Cannon states, "We have over 70 agents

in our office, and they do a great job promoting and marketing each charity. We change the sign in front of the office every month, and the community rallies around with support!"



After two years of cancellations and obstacles due to COVID restrictions, this is the first "normal" performance to come to the high school's stage since 2019. 

## **Prom Promise, Life Promise**

The CDC says 1 in 10 teens drink and drive and are 17 times more likely to die in a crash involving alcohol.

Hampton High School brought awareness to this on the morning of April 25<sup>th</sup>. The juniors and seniors walked to the community center where a mock crash was prepared with 4 student actors and volunteers from around the community.

It began with a sound recording of a 911 call and sirens heard in the distance as Hampton police sped to the scene. Shaler Hampton EMS, Hampton Township V.F.D, and Allegheny County police were right behind. The Medical Examiner and Coroner's Office volunteered their time as well. A hearse from King Funeral Home arrived at the mock scene to remove the deceased. A LifeFlight helicopter landed in the parking lot, which conveniently is one of the various spots designated for landing in Hampton. Homicide,

accident reconstruction, and collision reconstruction approached the scene and began taking measurements and pictures of everything. One important measurement they use is the length of the tire skid mark left by the speeding vehicle. Experts would be able to tell how fast the vehicle was going as well as a point-of-impact (POI) or an area-of-impact (AOI.)

Grace Pearson, one of the victims in the mock crash, could not believe how real everything felt. All of the first responders treated this as a real crash, including talking to the injured and keeping them calm, taking vitals, and even removing the car roof with the jaws of

life to get the victims out.

Senior Christian Liberto said, "I think it was a great demonstration. I could tell it touched everyone in the crowd and will definitely stop people from drinking and driving."

Back at the high school, guest speakers gave a presentation, including the District Attorney, a defense attorney,

and representatives from UPMC Children's Hospital.

It was obvious the students felt a sickly presence after watching some of their friends in

these terrible situations; whether it was being put on a stretcher and airlifted in a helicopter, being taken away in a hearse, or handcuffed in the back of a police car; all after a

tragic yet preventable situa-



The Hampton Shaler Water Authority (HSWA) was incorporated in 2011 and started operations in January 2012. HSWA was created as a result of a merger between the Shaler Water Department and the Hampton Township Municipal Authority.

HSWA prides itself on providing A-1 service to their customers. This has been proven as the authority was recognized this past March as a 2022 Banner Community by County Executive Rich Fitzgerald and the Allegheny League of Municipalities (ALOM). Their customer service department is staffed Monday-Friday between the hours of 7:30A.M-4:30P.M.

Customers of HSWA have multiple options for paying their bills, however, the most effective and convenient ways to pay your bill is through their automatic debiting program. Paying your bill in this way will eliminate the hassle of writing a check, paying your bill in person, or having to drive to one of the drop off locations. Your checking/savings account will automatically be debited for the net amount due on the due date that appears on your statement. Customers can easily sign up for this service by visiting the HSWA website at www.hswa-pa.org. From there, you will need to complete the "Automatic Payment Withdrawal Application," enclose a voided check and mail both back to the Authority's office at P.O. Box 3445, Pittsburgh, PA 15230-3445. You will continue to receive your bi-monthly water/sewer bill; however, that is merely a statement that should not be paid. On your bill it will state "DO NOT PAY-ACH CUSTOMER." This method of paying your bill is highly encouraged by the HSWA and can eliminate those over-due late charges in the event you forget to pay your bill!
