Al's Bike Drive 2018

I's bike drive is in full swing as they gear up for their Christmas delivery to the Marines Toys for Tots. This is Al's 11th year raising money to purchase bikes to be given to local children through the Toys For Tots program. Last year Al's group donated 1093 bikes and this year their delivery will be scheduled for early December.

The bike drive began when Al learned that the Marines program didn't have a lot of bicycles for children for Christmas. When you donate funds directly to the Toys for Tots Program, there's a \$30 limit to what the Marines can spend on a toy. Anything bigger, like a bicycle, must be donated directly. That's where Al and his team come in. Al's Bike drive supports two Marine-groups who distribute the bicycles to underprivileged children throughout Allegheny, Butler, and Beaver Counties as well as throughout Western Pennsylvania.

Donations are needed, as well as volunteers to help load the new bikes onto trucks, vans, and cars. Volunteers can also help transport the bikes as part of Al's caravan when they gather to load bikes and deliver to the Marines in December. A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred between September 7th, 2018—October 14th, 2018:


Theft from Vehicle

On October 5, 2018 at 10:05 a.m., a resident from Meadow Crest Drive reported to police that an unknown person(s) entered a tool chest in the bed of their pickup truck sometime during the overnight hours. The actor(s) stole a bucket of miscellaneous tools.

Single Vehicle Accident/DUI Arrest

On September 9, 2018 Hampton Township Police were dispatched to Middle Road for a single vehicle accident. Upon arrival, officers located a vehicle that had crashed into pillars in the driveway of a residence. The operator was not injured during the crash. The vehicle had to be towed from the scene. The operator showed visible signs of impairment and was unable to complete field sobriety tests as had been explained and demonstrated. The operator was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI.

On September 16, 2018 at 4:50 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Ferguson Road for a single vehicle rollover accident. Upon the officer's arrival, they observed a vehicle overturned off of the roadway and over a guide rail. The sole occupant was out of the overturned vehicle by the time officers arrived and denied injury. The operator showed visible signs of impairment, and was subsequently placed under arrest for DUI.





On October 23, 2018 at 10:52 a.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to East Hardies Road for a single vehicle rollover accident. Upon the officer's arrival, the operator was still sitting in the vehicle, and appeared to be confused, with slurred speech. The officer also detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating fro the operator's person. The accident appeared to have occurred when the involved vehicle.

cle was negotiating a bend in the roadway. It traveled off of the roadway while trying to negotiate a bend and struck a tree stump, which caused the vehicle to rollover. The vehicle was towed from the scene and the operator was transported to the hospital.

Vehicle Accident

On September 9, 2018 at 4:54 p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to Route 8 for what was originally reported to be an overturned tractor trailer. Upon the officers arrival, they located a T350 man-lift that was rolled on it's side, blocking a lane of travel. Hampton Fire Department responded to the scene and utilized a winch to lift the machine upright. The vehicle operator stated that he was turning right out of Hampton Plaza when the right side tire of the trailer struck the curb and the machine turned over, causing the trailer to flip. Once upright, the machine was able to be loaded onto the trailer and towed from the scene.

On September 14, 2018 at 12:14 a.m., Hampton Township officers were dispatched to Route 8, at McNeal Road, for a report of a single vehicle rollover accident with injuries. Upon arrival, officers located a vehicle resting on it's side in a parking lot. The two occupants were already out of the vehicle and denied injury. The accident occurred when the operator attempted to make a tight turn, was unable to navigate the turn, struck a concrete light pole base, which resulted in the rollover. The vehicle sustained disabling damage and had to be towed from the scene.


ing experience this season. In our conference our defense was third in least amount of points given up. We were 4 points away from being 4-1 going into the middle part of the season. Our last 5





Troop 17 is a very active troop, holding weekly meetings and participating in monthly activities. At the weekly meetings, scouts can work on merit badges or have scoutmaster conferences for rank advancements. Older scouts teach younger ones skills, like knot-tying, that help satisfy rank requirements. Sometimes there are special activities, like learning how to pitch tents (for newer scouts) and how to use a two-man saw.

The monthly activities vary, but always involve camping. During July, Troop 17 attended their annual week-long summer camp at Camp Mountaineer, outside Morgantown, WV. Also, in July, families attended the Altoona Curve baseball game and camped in the outfield overnight.
