Luke Crist Among Semifinalists



Four students from Central Catholic High School were named semifinalists in the 66th annual National Merit Scholarship Program, (NMSP). Liam Cringle, '21, Luke Crist, '21, Owen O'Malley, '21 and Liam Tinker, '21 are among approximately 16,000 semifinalists in the program.

Luke Crist is a Hampton resident and he qualified by taking the PSATs his junior year and scoring in the top 1% of people in the country. Luke said he was pleasantly surprised when he was notified in September that he was a semifinalist. In October, he submitted the essay portion of the application to the NMSP. The program provides college scholarships to the finalists. Luke will Luke is looking at several colleges and he is interested in biology, aerospace engineering, and possibly teaching. He is involved in Quiz Bowl, Extraordinary Ministry of the Eucharist, National Honor Society, and CYM Basketball for St. Catherines.

NMSC, a not-for-profit organization that operates without government assistance, was established in 1955 specifically to conduct the annual National Merit Scholarship Program. Scholarships are underwritten by NMSC with its own funds and by approximately 400 business organizations and higher education institutions that share NMSC's goals of honoring the nation's scholastic champions and encouraging the pursuit of academic excellence.

Hampton Football Gets Back to Success

This season saw a change to the Hampton Football program, and it was not just the 10-game schedule moving down to 7 in response to COVID-19. Hampton Football moved down from its prior 5A classification to 4A. This meant competing with different teams in addition to still playing area rivals such as Fox Chapel, Shaler, and Mars. Hampton did not play either Fox Chapel or Shaler in a game this year, but those matchups were originally scheduled before the shortened season was announced. This year, Hampton had a great season by going 5-2 and qualified for the Top 8 teams in all of 4A WPIAL Football. #8 Hampton matched up against #1 Aliquippa in the 4A WPIAL Playoffs. Hampton also won two shutouts this year; their most recent shutout before that was back in 2015. Hampton defeated Armstrong by a score of 17-0 in September and ended the season with a victory over Knoch 49-0.

To truly know the positive impact the 4A shift had and will have on Hampton Football, it's worth a look at the history. Through the majority of the 1980s and into the 1990s, Hampton Football was subpar at best. Discount two playoff seasons in 1988 & 1994 and Hampton would

be 37-81-3 (.318) from 1984 through 1997.

After Hampton brought in the young Greg Mihalik as head coach starting in 1998, the Talbots went off running. In 2001, the Talbots went a perfect 9-0 in the regular season, having their best season yet. The Talbots' only loss was in the playoffs to West Allegheny who later won the state title that year. In 2004, the Talbots went 8-3 and played a tough game against highly favored West Allegheny in the quarterfinals, losing by a score of 52-42; almost achieving revenge. In 2005, Hampton almost pulled off another undefeated regular season, their only loss that regular season came from Pine-Richland by a score of 43-42. After two down years in 2007 and 2008, Hampton still had some unfinished business before the 2000s would go out. That unfinished business was making it to the semifinals as Hampton was 0-8 in the quarterfinals.

In 2009, Hampton had a 5-4 regular season record and nothing special seemed on the horizon. Head coach Jacque DeMatteo didn't let Hampton's #14 seed stop the Talbots from upsetting #3 Chartiers Valley and then #6 Uniontown en route to the semifinals, losing to Hopewell by a score of 31-9. Hampton was one game shy of playing at Heinz Field for the WPIAL Title but still made up the Final 32 teams in the statewide bracket. The Hampton Football Program looked like it was slowly declining through the early-2010s but the Talbots in 2014 proved otherwise. Hampton finished with a 9-2 record and almost got past the quarterfinals again, losing to Ringgold in a close game of 21-20. The next year in 2015, Hampton started off 5-0 but couldn't get hot late in the season, only finishing 7-4 and ending the season in a lopsided playoff loss to Central Valley. Getting far in the playoffs was always realistic for Hampton while in 3A. But when Hampton moved up to 5A after the PIAA restructured the classes for a 4A \rightarrow 6A scale, those playoff realities for Hampton were starting to fade.

In 2016, Hampton would go 0-10 as a result of the switch. Hampton would have to face top football programs like Penn Hills, Woodland Hills, and North Hills on a regular basis. In a January TribLive report, Head Coach Jacque DeMatteo cited team sizes as a big drawback. "When you're facing a 70-to-80-man roster, and you have 35 to 45, that's not cutting it." Hampton went 6-34 in 5A from 2016 to 2019.

The move to 4A brought better success for Hampton moving forward. For 2020 and on, Hampton Football will face more similar-sized opponents, a change that may likely bring many more successes similar to 2014.

Lindgren Recognized for Rushing Feat

2019-2020 Hampton Talbot Senior #36, Luke Lindgren, received an incredibly special football from the Hampton Touchdown Club



commemorating his spectacular 1,000-yard rushing season. The football was painted by the person who paints the footballs for the Steelers. Lindgren remarked, "It was a great accomplishment that I couldn't have done without my teammates and my coaching staff." Lindgren is a freshman at Slippery Rock University, majoring in Safety Management, and is currently working diligently to walk on to the Slippery Rock football team.

Instead, what Carslaw did was challenge each competitive team to come up with an idea and host a service project on their own. "I wasn't sure they were going to do it," said Carslaw. "With everything that's going on, it would have been understandable."

But it seemed the Pittsburgh Northstars Gymnastics team was up for the challenge. The boy's team held a car wash and raised over \$1,000 for Children's Cancer Research in the name of WillPower. The levels 5 and 7 teams held bake sales to raise money for animal (Continued on page 14)


