Transformer Fire

On August 30, 2020 at 7:54 p.m., Hampton Township Police and Fire Department were dispatched to Sample Court for a power line that was reported to have caught tree branches on fire. struck another car and guide rail and was swerving all over the roadway. A Hampton Township officer was able to intercept the vehicle on Route 8, observed multiple traffic violations, and initiated a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the operator displayed signs of impairment. Upon further investigation, the operator was also found to be in possession of drugs and paraphernalia. The driver was subsequently placed under arrest for possession and suspicion of DUI.

Vehicle Accident

On August 25, 2020 at 2:30 p.m., Hampton Township officers responded to Route 8, near Hardies Road, for a two-vehicle accident. Upon arrival, officers located both vehicles, which sustained disabling damage and were towed from the scene. The accident was said to have occurred when one vehicle, which was traveling north on Route 8 in the passing lane, stopped for a vehicle that was stopped in the roadway ahead, partially obstructing the passing lane. Upon doing so, the vehicle was struck from behind. One operator was transported to the hospital.

On August 28, 2020 at 2:07 p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to the area of West Hardies Road, at North Pioneer Road, for a two-vehicle accident. Both vehicles sustained heavy, disabling damage as a result of the collision. The accident was said to have occurred when one vehicle operator was waiting at the stop sign on North Pioneer Road to turn onto West Hardies Road. The operator was waved out by another vehicle operator but failed to see an oncoming car and entered the intersection, which resulted in the collision. Both vehicles had to be towed from the scene due to extensive damage.

On August 28, 2020 at 2:27 p.m., Hampton Township Police responded to East Bardonner Road and Haberlein Road for a two-vehicle accident. Both involved vehicles were found to have sustained disabling damage, and both had to be towed from the scene. The accident was said to have occurred when the operator of one vehicle attempted to turn left onto Haberlein Road from East Bardonner Road. The second involved vehicle was traveling on East Bardonner Road, and as they were driving through the intersection, the other car turned left in front of them, resulting in the collision.

Hazardous Conditions

On August 27, 2020 at approximately 6:40 p.m., Hampton Township Police and Fire Departments were dispatched to multiple locations for hazardous conditions resulting from a storm system that affected the township. The calls for service included fallen trees, utility wires down, transformer fires, and water condition problems.

Phone Scam

On September 4, 2020 at 12:35 p.m., Hampton Township Police were advised of a phone scam by a resident from Sylvan Drive. The reporting party stated that they received a phone call from a male with an accent who claimed to be an agent with the FBI. The male told the resident that they were under

The Hampton High School Varsity Football Team is now 2-1 on the season after shutting out Armstrong, beating Highlands last week 28-21, and enduring a tough loss to Mars in week 1. The team is playing in a new conference this year after dropping to the 4A classification from 5A, where they were one of the smallest schools competing at that level. There is a lot of optimism around the team and the Talbots control their own destiny to make the playoffs. Head Coach Jacque DeMatteo remarked, "There are a bunch of seniors that are providing great leadership this year." In addition, Defensive Lineman Coach, Ron "Goody" Gooden commented, "The seniors are really providing a culture
