The Hampton Township Police Department is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of our residents and guests by providing the very best in law enforcement services. The twenty-two officers and two civilian clerks take pride in serving the community in a professional and proactive manner. Thank you to the staff for helping to keep our community safe.


A summary of noteworthy incidents that occurred are listed below. These incident statistics included, but WERE NOT LIMITED TO, the following between the dates of 6/26/2021—7/30/2021:

Unemployment Fraud

 Multiple Hampton Township residents have notified the Hampton Township Police Department of attempted unemployment fraud. The residents have reported that their employer notified them of an attempted unemployment claim in their name. Residents are advised to monitor their credit and to report fraudulent claims to the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry.

DUI

 On July 3, 2021 at 1:08a.m., a Hampton Township Officer observed a vehicle jerking back and forth from left to right within its lane. The vehicle in question also almost struck the curb twice and was driving at an unsafe distance away from the vehicle in front of it. A traffic stop was initiated on the vehicle in question. Upon approaching the operator, the officer detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the operator and the vehicle. The officer also observed that the operator displayed visible signs of impairment. The operator was asked to submit to standardized field sobriety tests, in which the driver failed to complete as instructed. The operator was placed into custody for suspicion of DUI.

Lueers officially launched AQUALITY in August and has been fulfilling orders with the incredible support of the community. If enough bottles are sold, the first clean water project will be complete by Thanksgiving 2021, bringing water to a community of over 600 people.

Mount Royal Boulevard. A traffic stop on the vehicle was initiated. Upon approaching the operator, the officer detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage as well as the operator having slurred speech and glassy eyes. The driver was asked to submit to standardized field sobriety tests, which they failed to complete as was demonstrated and instructed. The operator was subsequently placed under arrest for the suspicion of DUI.

Traffic Accident

On June 30, 2021 at 1:15p.m., Hampton Township Police were dispatched to the area of William Flinn Highway and Anderson Drive for a report of a two vehicle accident. Adult Swim Training to Begin

Organized training for *adult* lap swimmers will begin at the Hampton High School pool in mid- September. Matthew is a ten-year cancer survivor, having been diagnosed just two months before his second birthday with acute myeloid leukemia, a type of blood cancer. Matthew was treated for weeks at a time at Children's Hospital over the course of about five months before he entered remission. His mom, Erin, said, "We knew how fortunate we were to be at Children's. The amount of help we received from foundations like the ALSF drives us to give back in any way possible. We are even more driven when places in our community, like Panera and Applebees offer to host us and donate part of their sales towards the cause."

The family hosted a lemonade stand inside Panera on August 5th with lemonade and small treats available in exchange for any donation. Panera offered a percentage of their sales of their Agave Lemonade to go to Alex's Lemon-

ade Stand Foundation, and its employees made cute lemon-shaped cookies and set out information about the stand. Matthew said, "I'm glad that I can help raise money for kids that had cancer like I did, or other cancers. I get nervous that we won't raise a lot of money but a lot of people put way more money in the jar than I expected! It makes me feel good." Brady enjoyed selling the lemonade. He said, "I like filling up the cups and hand-

ing out the lemonade. It's good when more people come!" As a Hero Family, they host the stand and share their story of Matthew's cancer journey and explain ALSF's mission with those who stop by.

"As for Matthew," his mom Erin said, "he has been great! During the days following his first chemo treatments, he showed us he will never let anything slow him down! He has definitely shown us the importance of living life to its fullest and is one of the most active kids I know. He is in his 5th year of youth football, loves to jump on the trampoline, climb trees, ride bikes, hike, hang out with friends, and loves amusement parks!"

In the fall, the Concannon family will walk with the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society for a Light the Night Walk, continuing to raise awareness for blood cancers. This is a link that shows all the different ways people can contribute.

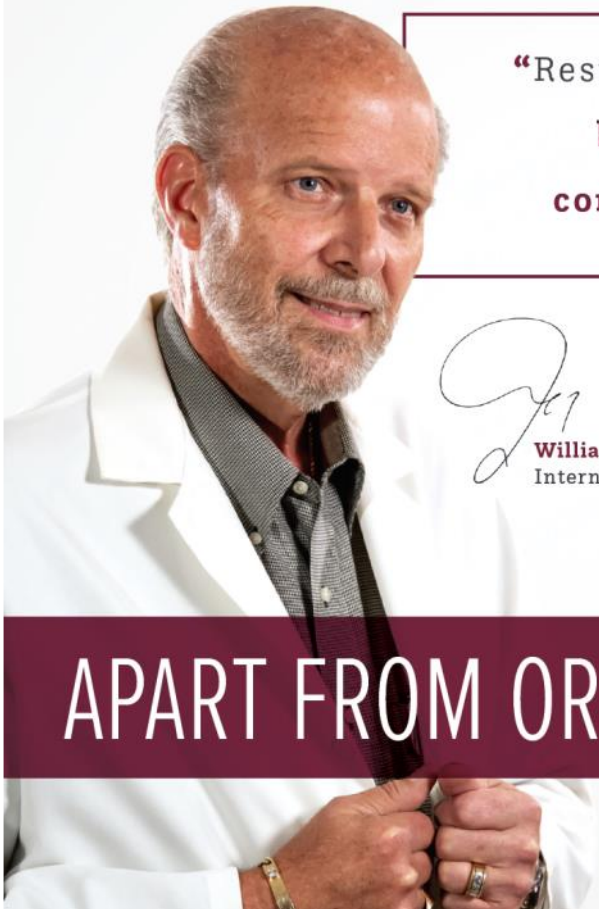
