



Childlike, Not Childish, Pt. II

Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child-this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 18:4

He leaned over, placed his two fingers in my mouth, and stretched my lips apart with enough force to separate my skin

from my body. Then, he stuck a metallic vacuum cleaner in my mouth and completely dried my gums. It felt so unnatural! I hated it! But nothing caused as much anxiety as what I heard next, "This might pinch a little." I knew what was coming! Shots! Sting! Pain! Numbness! Horror!

By now you know that I'm referring to a visit to the dentist. The above words were written a long time ago, when I was young. Still, I confess that I loathe a trip to the dentist office. I know the dentist is necessary...I know it's for my own good...I know I'll be better offin the long run for having gone...BUT I HATE THE DISCOMFORT!

I imagine that you can identify with me, can't you? We've all been there. In fact, we're there now... together. As we head into the Fall season, still not back in the sanctuary, I feel as if someone is looking at our congregation and saying, "This could pinch a little bit." We know it's necessary. We know that we'll be better off in the long run. We know that it has to be done. BUT IT STILL CAUSES DISCOMFORT!

Which brings me to Matthew 18:4. As we began last week, we're looking at the characteristics of being childlike, not childish. The first characteristic in childlikeness is imagination.

The second characteristic of being childlike is trust! Children naturally trust those in authority, especially parents and grandparents (until it is proven to them that they cannot trust). They believe that those responsible for their well being will act in ways consistent with what's best.

I am intent on being childlike this Fall, even in the midst of uncertainty and discomfort! I cannot stop the anxiety that comes with waiting, but I can guarantee this: We will go forward! We WILL continue to worship God—with our hearts and our minds—through song, praise, prayer and proclamation! I promise you that the messages I preach in our time away from the sanctuary will be as important to me as the ones I have preached in the sanctuary! We WILL still see lives changed! We recently baptized 4 young people whose lives have been touched by the gospel. I expect us to continue baptizing. Finally, we WILL still love! I am continually amazed at how you care for each other (and for me and my family). I expect to see that grow stronger in days ahead!

As you finish reading the words of someone who struggles...just like you...let me encourage you to reach up your little hand...no matter what you're dealing with...and take the Hand of One who can be trusted. As another struggler wrote, some 3000 years ago, "Whenever I am a fraid, I will trust in You." Psalm 56:3
