DEAR ROBERT, HELLO-

WE ARE ALL SO GLAD TO HEAR THAT YOU ARE SAFE AND UNHURT. WE FEEL THAT YOU WILL BE TREATED WELL. IF ONLY YOU WILL RECEIVE THE SAME GOOD CARE THEIRS OVER HERE ARE RECEIVING. MARY LOU AND I VISITED YOUR MOTHER IN FEBRUARY. SHE SEEMED IN GRAND SPIRITS, AND LOOKED VERY FINE TO US. I SHALL NEVER FORGET HER.

PAUL IS IN FARRAGUT IDAHO- THINK HE HAS HAD THE MUMPS. I WROTE HIM TO BE CAREFUL AS HE MIGHT HURT THE FUTURE GENERATION, HA HA. FRANCES RUTH IS STILL AT THE SAME PLACE . SHE SENT US SOME NICE CHRISTMAS GIFTS . ROBERT YOU DONT WANT TO TEACH ANY ONE ELSE TO PLAY MOON AND LET THEM BEAT YOU OVER THERE, HA. WE ARE SURE GETTING DULL ON OUR BRIDGE.
