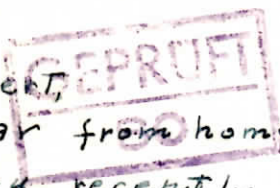

DEAR ROBERT,

I HEAR FROM HOME THAT THEY HAVE HEARD FROM YOU RECENTLY IN A LETTER. I AM SO HAPPY THAT YOU ARE WELL & SAFE, ALSO THAT YOUR CREW CAME THROUGH SAFELY.

I HAVE TRAVELED CONSIDERABLY SINCE THE FIRST OF THE YEAR, FIRST TO THE NORTH & THEN BACK SOUTH AGAIN. IT RAINS QUITE OFTEN HERE BUT IT IS WARM. I LIKE WHERE I AM NOW BUT I WILL BE LEAVING SOON. I WEIGH 160 POUNDS & I AM SIX FEET & TWO ONE-HALF INCHES TALL.

EVERYONE IS ASKING ABOUT YOU. MILTON SANFORD GOT A LETTER FROM YOU RECENTLY. I HOPE YOU HAVE HEARD FROM US BY NOW.

I WENT INTO TOWN LAST NIGHT & HAD A SWELL TIME. I WENT TO A DANCE THAT WAS LOUSY WITH WOMEN, SO I DID MY PART. THE TOWN HAS LOTS OF RECREATION ALTHOUGH IT IS NOT VERY LARGE. I SHALL GO TO TOWN AGAIN NEXT WEEK-END. I AM GOING TO SCHOOL BUT I WILL COMPLETE MY SCHOOL SOON.

I HOPE TO GO HOME SOON FOR A SHORT VISIT. I HOPE THIS LETTER REACHES YOU SOON.

I MISS YOU A LOT, MORE & MORE EVERY DAY. I WILL WRITE AGAIN SOON.
