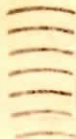

Dearest Robert,

Mother sent me her letter to transcribe on to you and I do so with pleasure.

Your letter came on April 2. We were so happy to see your handwriting again and it was the most wonderful news to know that you were uninjured. I read and reread your letter many times each day. We received your address on March 2 and have sent a cable-gram. We certainly do miss your letters and we were getting your letters often. Many of our letters have returned from England.

Have you met any Texas boys there? A lady wrote me from Hereford, Texas that her son is there--2nd Lt. George T. Jones--#1940. He was also reported missing on December 20th. Hereford is not far from Wildorado, Texas.

We have had letters from Mrs. Riley, Mrs. Kodis, Mrs. Hansen, Mrs. Brooks, and Mrs. Mariani. Mrs. Kodis baby girl was born in December. We look at the crew picture often. Are all of you safe? How did you arrive in Germany? Did you use your parachute?

Paul Junior went to Farragut, Idaho on January 3rd. He went to Spokane, Washington twice to spend the day. Then he was sent to Gulfport, Miss. on April 1st to study. He wrote an interesting letter of his 4 day train trip. Eva Louise came on February 17. She was looking fine (oh, you bet!). We surely enjoyed her visit.

Tom Williams was here last week. Everyone asks of you. You are the town's hero. We will be so glad when you return home. We sent cigerrates and will get a package off soon. Hops you can write us what to send. Spring is slowly coming to West Texas, but we need rain. (In my last letter from home, Mother mentioned a sandstorm--good old West Texas!)

The Red Cross send us the Prisoner of War Bulletin each month and it gives a description of Stalag 3.
