August 10, 1944

in March this week. We were certainly glad to hear from you.
I hope that by now you have heard from us and have received
the packages.

Paul Jr. was in Idaho, Miss. and now California. He was
walking down a street in San Francisco and a boy from McCauley
Texas called his name. The boy saw Duna first. They were
very glad to see each other and have a long talk.

I see your car and it looks as good as ever. I wish
I had bought it when you left. I hope we can all get a car
when you get back. Wouldn't that be fine?

I have had letters from Mrs. Brooks, Mrs. Hansen, Lee
and Helen, also a darling picture of the baby son. How many
are in the camp that you know. Lee has yet to receive any
good word.

We had rain, but now another heat wave is here on its
11th day over the state. I sent Birthday Greetings, but guess
that letter will be late. Everyone asks of you and we are
thinking of you all of the time. I keep remembering where
you were a year ago. David Rodden went there also. Both
Wade, Jr. and David have moved on from Jigg's location. We
hope that you are well and that you have received letters
from the states. Write, with love-- Mother

Last week the folks received a letter from Shirley--just
a friendly note, explaining who she is, her work, and how
she knew you. Mother wrote asking me if you are engaged.
Ha! Are you? I also thought that I might add that your
letters are making the rounds of relatives and maybe all of
Hamlin, beginning with the Post Office bunch. Ha!
