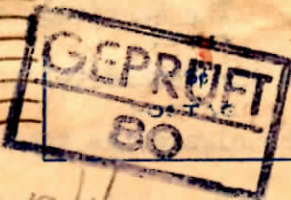

September 18, 1944

Dearest Robert,

Last week-end Barb came down from Philadelphia to visit me. We went bike-riding again on Sunday for a distance of about 10 miles. We are quite athletes!

On the week-end previous Mrs. Carlton came to visit me from Norfolk, where she is visiting Rosemary. She came east because Rosemary is to have her baby this month. I showed her the town and all of the sights that I could during the three days that she was here. A new boy-friend of mine was really nice-by taking Mrs. Carlton and me to dinner at one of the best hotels in town. That was quite a rare treat.

Mother received a letter from Duna after quite a bit

of time had elapsed. He is well, but is expecting further assignment, which will still be in Brud's old area. Last Saturday was Duna's nineteenth birthday.

The folks received a nice letter from Auvic and wife in California. They were asking for your address and were inquiring about you.

The American Legion of Stephenville sent a write up to the Herald telling of the folk's letter of thanks for the cigarettes that you had received! It was very nice.

Mrs. Riley wrote me an interesting letter. All along Lee has had hope for her husband, but we now know that there is no hope. She has not been told as yet. The Fowlers realize how much they have to be thankful for.
