



SONH Corvette - Group Riding Guidelines

GENERAL

When arriving at the morning starting location, please have a full tank of gas and an empty bladder then be ready to have some serious fun! At least two members of the caravan (the lead and tail gunner) will have two-way radios.

We recommend everyone have and use two-way radios, the Midland GTX-1000AZ (Amazon \$39.99) and optionally you can purchase the cigarette light adapter separately. If you **don't** have a radio, it's helpful if you provide your cell phone number to your lead & tail gunner in the event you need to pull over and leave the group or get separated from the group. If you **do** have a radio, please keep conversational chatter to a minimum so that announcements and warnings by the leader/tail gunner can be broadcast in a timely manner.

Absolutely no passing other members of the Caravan while in route unless it's for <u>safety reasons</u>. If you feel the need to get around a car in front of you, use one of our stops (bio or lunch) to get in line ahead of that car as we get back on route.

Maintain a safe distance from the car in front of you **BUT** <u>do</u> not fall too far behind either. 3 car lengths on the back roads and maybe 4 or 5 lengths on the highway are safe distances but most importantly it keeps us riding as <u>one group</u>. And also helps to reduce the accordion effect for the people in the back of the group, if you've been back there you know what I mean. Never ride over your head, if you have a concern about the ride, speak to your ride leader at the next stop.

If your car is a manual and you tend to down shift to stop, during any caravan/group ride tap your brake pedal a couple times so the person behind you knows you're slowing down or stopping. This goes a long way in preventing rear end collisions, it's just like using your turn signal to let people behind you know you're turning. Rear end collisions are the number 1 cause of accidents in group rides.

Speaking of turn signals, the use of turn signals is required during caravans. Your turn signal notifies the car behind you and the car behind you and so on, the group is turning.

STAY ALERT

Again, the most common accident in a caravan is the rear-end collision. Please don't let yourself get too distracted, we're going to be traveling through some beautiful roads and countryside, do your best to stay focused on your driving.

If you have a passenger, have that person act as your navigator to assist with directions, <u>caravan related cell phone use</u>, <u>two-way radio use</u>, etc. As the driver, your primary job is to drive your car with minimal distractions keeping you, your passenger and those cars around you safe. Not only watch just the car directly in front of you, but also watch 4-5 cars <u>ahead of you</u>. This gives you a better reaction time to avoid an accident, know when the group is taking a turn or coming to a stop sign.

DRIVING IN TOWN

Obey traffic signs, no running stop lights or blocking intersections.

In town:

when we encounter traffic lights, if there are 2 open lanes so we can line up side by side, use both lanes going in our direction. This can allow more of us to make the next green light. If we're in just 1 lane keep the distance to the car in front of you tight when stopped at the light. When turning green, again keep the distance tight in an effort to get all the cars through the light.

If we get split up, we will re-group **where possible**. We will try to pull over on the side of the road, but this is not always possible on some of the roads we'll be traveling. When available we'll get off the road into a parking lot to re-group. If we pull over in a small parking lot, be kind to those behind you and do your best to double or triple up or pull off to the side of the lot so <u>everyone can exit the road</u> and park safely in the parking lot. Just another reason to have quality two-way radios in your car. If we get split-up the leader or tail gunner can communicate to those stuck at a light where the group is.

Lastly, stay safe by following these simple guidelines and

have fun!
