As we all seem to be currently surrounded by cold and snow, we thought that February might be a good time to start to think about Corvette maintenance and in making a plan on what we should do to help keep our Corvettes in top running condition. come warmer weather! So, this month, here are just a few reminders as to what areas we think you might want to look at and consider maintenance wise on.


That Big Black Brick in your glovebox

As mentioned in our opening February statement, let's talk about that big black encased brick in your glove box. The one that fills the majority of it and sits unused and maybe 1 in 10 owners ever pull out and open!

Reading it is something that truly should be a requirement for every

Corvette owner of both new and used cars alike to read.

The information contained is not only incredibly detailed and covers every possible subject related to the car, It is extremely accurate to the information about your particular Corvette. Every option is called out in the book and every sub model option is also listed. If there is something you have a question about, chances are it's contained in the owner's manual. There is an easy to find index in the front that will help you find exactly the subject you are looking for. And now if you prefer, every Corvette owner's manual is available as a downloadable PDF file that you can put on your desktop, laptop or even your smart phone. And all that knowledge is then right at your finger-tips... and the next time you are bored and decide to watch a cute video of some baby goats on your phone, instead just take the plunge and open up your Corvette owner's manual and dive it. You'll be thankful you did when some question comes up later and you already know the answer!



Corvette fluids!

Many of us are all told by our cars when it's time to get the engine oil changed. Maintenance lights blink at us, warning messages flash across our dash, all urging us to get to the dealership as soon as possible and get this maintenance issue item taken care of. Thankfully most Corvette owners are more than pro-active when it comes to keeping the oil in our engines changed and clean. Many times, long before they are at the end of the fluid's life cycle. But one thing that Corvette owners also share with metal car owners, is the lack of information in knowing when the maintenance of all the other fluids in our vehicles need to be serviced and changed. There are in all vehicles today, several other wearable lubrication and functioning fluids that do require periodic servicing. Transmission fluids in the C8 are one of the first things that every owner is made aware of at the time of purchase. Specific mileage intervals are critical in maintaining and ensuring the continued proper operation of this extremely complex transmissions. But there are others that sometimes can fall by the wayside, such as the cooling antifreeze, brake fluid, clutch fluid for older generations, and finally the differential fluid. Each of these have recommended service intervals that must be adhered to as closely as the engine oil and transmissions service intervals. Every fluid in our cars has a life cycle and not only do they keep the moving mechanisms operating smooth and cool, they in fact keep these components from failing. As they age, they become deluded, the chemical compounds break down as moisture forms and the effectiveness of their lubricating properties drops off dramatically. Depending upon which fluid it is, the service intervals will vary, with replacement required typically between 30,000 and 50,000 miles. And you'll not only keep the performance of your car to peak levels, you'll ensure a long healthy life for all its critical components. And guess what, all these intervals are called out in your... you guest it... owners manual!



Filters and Wipers

Just a few more simple easy to perform maintenance things you can take care of and perform yourself. Change out your engine air filter and cabin filter each new driving season! Both you and your car will breath better if you do! And even though most of you who proclaim will never drive their Corvettes in the rain, throw on a new set of high quality wiper blades, each spring just in case you ever happen to get caught out in the unexpected shower which in itself is annoying enough, but doubled by streaky wipers going back and forth you can't see through!

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Tires and getting old... the tires that is!

I see it more often than I'd care to think about. Corvettes with tires that appear when visually inspecting them from the sides appear to be in like new condition. But a little more digging reveals that they are not new at all. And, in fact many of them carry a DOT production date code that is far removed from present day!

And, these older tires all should be replaced regardless of the amount of tread still showing. Tires over 5-7 years old regardless of tread depth should be replaced. No matter if you own a garage queen or an everyday driver. Every tire produced since 2000 carries a manufactured date, which tells you the month and year that the tire was produced i. It's always the last four numbers that can be found on only one side of the tire sidewall as part of the DOT manufacturing information stamped into the sidewall. If you don't see it on one side then look on the other... it's there!

It shows the week and year that the tire was produced. 2624 for example, means this tire was produced in the 26th week of 2024.

Tires today are made up of a multitude of compounds and differing materials, many of which are susceptible to the harshness of our environment. The ultraviolet rays from the sun, (the biggest culprit) to the effects of the unseen gases in our atmosphere all take their toll on the tire compounds over time. Additionally, these tire compounds eventually dry up and develop outer stress cracking as shown in the pictures. Something you don't want to be thinking about while enjoying a afternoon cruise out on the highway... or worse, enjoying some spirited driving. And while the chances of these stress cracks causing a tire to actually fail are low, it can and does happen! So, why risk everything on something that is totally preventable. Just Get em replaced! And remember the stress cracks can also occur on the sidewalls as often as in between the tread blocks!

And, one final footnote on the **Michelin** tires that many of us have on our cars. If you happen to have newer tires, say 2-3 years old and you find they are developing stress cracks. Then reach out to **Michelin** and file a warranty claim, as many times they will stand firmly behind their products and offer you a credit towards replacement **Michelins**. They are a customer service first company and will always work with you to resolve this issue, or any other, many times being extremely generous in the amount of credit they may offer.

A concerning trend or real opportunity

As the calendar has turned to February, there is a trend that is still occurring at Chevrolet dealer lots all across the country. The growing inventory of unsold new Corvette C8 Stingrays and yes includes even some Z06's just sitting there unsold on the lots! At last count, recorded by industry insiders there were close to 5,000 new unsold Stingrays littering Chevrolet lots. And this trend has been this way throughout most of 2025 as sales have cooled for new Corvette base models. This is by far the biggest level of inventory of not only C8's but of Corvettes in general ever! Not since the 2019 C7's, have so many new Corvettes just been setting around unsold on dealer lots and in that case, knowing the new C8 were about to be released explains why that happened. Why is it happening again now and should this be an alarming concern? The answer is well...both yes and no. It depends on for who. For GM and the dealerships, it should raise some eyebrows and a bit of concern as nobody makes money when new cars sit unsold. No matter the model car. In fact, it costs money each month for new unsold cars to just sit on the lot. Dealerships still have to pay something called a floor plan for all the inventory they possess. And, on an average size dealership, the floor plan costs each month can add up to \$30-50,000 as a direct out-of-pocket expense as its simply put, the interest costs to borrow the money that pays for the car inventory they keep. Some of this money is captured back from the manufacturers, but it's still a very hefty expense. And while every car not special ordered has a certain floor plan dollar amount built into it, the longer the car sits unsold, the more these costs increase and eat into the vehicle profit the dealership makes when it does eventually sell.

For those who are in the market for a new C8, this can and will definitely affect the price of what dealerships are willing to accept in order to sell you that car. And, also long as you are willing to perhaps compromise on some of the options you are looking for, it can be a great way to save thousands off the MSRP asking price. Have some flexibility in the interior and exterior colors, and then ask the dealership which Corvette they have had the longest on their lot and work towards making a deal on that car to happen! Trust me, if the car has been there long enough, they'll work really hard towards putting you in the driver's seat! Especially during these winter months when dealer foot traffic and interest in sports cars is at the lowest point of the year, and plan your visit at the end of the month when the next floor plan bill will soon come due.

Grand Sport Update

One of the things that it seems in this day and age of instant information is it's virtually impossible to keep a secret. And even more so when something requires lots of people to be involved in it. Take for example the much-rumored new Corvette Grand Sport model! Article after articles have been flying around for months now about a potential upcoming Grand Sport to round out the C8 lineup and take us into the next generation C9 sometime in 2028-2029. Throw in the much-maligned AI information that we mentioned earlier and you have a whole bucket full of true and false information being dispersed! So, lets add to it! The Grand Sport is going to be released sometime in the coming 2026 year as a 2027 model. It will come with an all-new 6.7 V8 powerplant... and here is the mind-blowing part. It's looking like A manual transmission is going to be an available option! Yup! Lots of information is currently being disseminated down to the dealership level as they are being told to prepare for this upcoming model announcement. A all new 6.7-liter, 409 cubic inch displacement motor will produce somewhere around 550HP and 510 ft. lbs. of torque, placing it squarely in between the 495 HP of the standard stingray and the 670HP of the Z06. I'm also being told that GM is holding off on making the official announcement as long as possible, in order to try and relieve the backlog of current new unsold Stingrays setting on dealer lots, which with this announcement could potentially further prolong! many of which are 2LT & 3LT models with prices approaching close to what the new GS will be announced at. One question that will arise is will the new standard powerplant transition to the 6.7 in the Stingray as well. Doesn't make much sense for GM to offer the new motor in just the GS. But then again, it is GM...

One of the first big questions should be... Does a particular club's intended purpose and level and type of activities match what we think we would enjoy?

Some clubs can simply be small groups of people who occasionally like to gather to talk Corvette shop and perhaps enjoy a meal together surrounded by their cars. They tend to be a more relaxed and while having some level of organization, are based off the premise of being an informal club. But they can still be very enjoyable to those who are looking for a low commitment type of club to join. You still get to enjoy time around other Corvette enthusiasts and develop friendships together, you participate when you want and don't require you to make an all out yearly commitment or spend money to be a part of.

Others are national organizations, that have very large memberships and hold or sponsor national events throughout the year. Most of these clubs are on-line based and typically don't hold local events for members to attend. They require some sort of fee to join and they host centrally located national large group gatherings a couple of times a year. There is extensive travel usually required and involves big crowds gathering over a weekend.

Then the third type is what makes up the vast majority of the Corvette clubs on the landscape, yet can still vary when it comes to activities and purpose. Many of these types of club typically charge some sort of annual membership dues and their intended purpose can widely vary. But in all cases, you will get to experience what being a part of a Corvette community is like.

Next, aren't all Corvette clubs made up of just old people? No!

The average age of club members actually mirrors that of the average age of Corvette ownership. Which is around 58 years young! And, since GM first introduced the C8, this number has dropped significantly, as the C8 is the number one selling sports car of people under 35! So, the average club's demographic makeup is changing drastically as well.

Next, what is the structure of the club? Some clubs are centered first around the social aspect of Corvette ownership, with lots of dinners out together, an occasional ride and a philanthropic approach at giving back to the community. All of which are good things BTW! Other clubs like ours center much of their activities around driving these cars and while the end results do add a high level of social element, it's secondary to the time spent together behind the wheel of our cars. So, no matter the reason, we always encourage every Corvette owner to consider finding and joining a club that matches their own interests. You'll open up a whole new world of fun, comradery and developing friendships.
