

A very special thank you goes out to **Deb Stewart** for organizing and putting this great event together and also for leading our group on this amazingly gratifying and emotional day!







# First Caravan Event!




Members of both **SOMEC** and **SONHC** are invited to come along on this first of many future adventures around the vast and beautiful State of Maine!

#### **C7** Transmission Issues

For those who have a C7 auto, there seems to be an issue that continues to rear its ugly head: the dreaded transmission shudder. An unacceptable and troubling issue that, for many, GM has refused to take care of under warranty and instead is calling it a maintenance issue! Cars with 15,000 miles and less are experiencing this issue of vibration and inconsistent shifting. And the troubling part is that GM knows the why behind this issue, yet — so far — for many they have refused to step up and take care of it under warranty. Moisture in the transmission is the cause and the remedy, while pretty straight forward, is an expensive one! The transmission fluid must be flushed several times to get the moisture out of both the transmission itself and the accompanying defective fluid. Some members have paid upwards of \$1,100 to have this problem fixed. C'mon GM! You can do better!

## SO ME CORVETTES

Thank you, Mark Hensley, SOME Corvettes Administrator Extraordinaire, for posting these Fun Facts on the SOME Corvettes Facebook page. There is so much history surrounding these beautiful cars.

#### **Corvette Fun Facts — C1 (1953–1962)**

1. Debut and Limited Production: The C1 Corvette made its debut in 1953 at the General Motors Motorama event in New York City. The very first production Corvette rolled off the assembly line in Flint, Michigan in June of that year. Only 300 units were produced initially.



#### 2. Solid-Axle Design:

The C1 is often referred to as the "solid-axle" generation because it featured a solid rear axle. Independent rear suspension didn't appear until the 1963 Sting Ray model.

- **3. Polo White and Red Interior:** The initial batch of C1 Corvettes came in the iconic Polo White exterior color with black canvas soft tops. All of them had a striking red interior.
- 4. Six-Cylinder Engine: In its early years, the C1 Corvette was only available as a convertible and featured a six-cylinder engine. An eight-cylinder engine was added in 1955, along with a three-speed manual gearbox.
- **5. Optional Hardtop:** Starting in 1956, an optional hardtop was offered for the C1 Corvette, providing additional versatility for drivers.
- 6. Harley Earl's Influence: Harley Earl, head of GM's Styling Section, was a sports car enthusiast and recognized the popularity of European sports cars among GIs returning from World War II. This inspired the creation of the Corvette.
- **7. 150 Horsepower I6 Engine:** The first C1 Corvettes were powered by a 150-horsepower 3.9L inline-six engine paired with a two-speed automatic transmission.



- 8. Mixed Reviews and Sales: Initial reviews of the C1 Corvette were mixed, and sales fell short of expectations. However, Chevrolet made necessary improvements to keep the program alive.
- **9. Nine-Year Production Run:** The C1 Corvette remained in production for nine years until it was replaced by the second-generation Corvette (C2) in 1962.
- **10. Historic Auction Sale:** In March 2021, the most expensive C1 Corvette in the United States was sold by Barrett-Jackson for \$825,000, making it a sought-after collector's item.


## SO ME CORVETTES

#### **Corvette Fun Facts — C3 (1968–1982)**

- 1. Stingray Name: The Stingray name, which had been used for the 1963–67 C2 generation, returned for the C3 but as a single word ("Stingray") for the 1969–76 model years.
- 2. Factory Sunroof: The C3 was the first Corvette to feature a factory-installed sunroof, allowing drivers to enjoy open-air driving with ease.
- 3. Built Entirely in St. Louis:
  The C3 was the first Corvette to be entirely built in St. Louis, Missouri, where it was assembled from 1968 to 1982 when production moved to Bowling Green Kentucky.
- **4. Rear Window Defroster:** It introduced the rear window defroster feature, enhancing visibility during colder weather.
- **5. Four Round Tail Lights:** The C3 was the first Corvette to sport four round tail lights, a design element that became iconic for this generation.
- 6. Angular and Muscular Design: Departing from its predecessors, the C3 featured a more angu-

lar and muscular appearance, earning it the nickname "Coke bottle" design.

- 7. T-Top Removable Roof
  Panels: The C3 introduced
  T-top removable roof
  panels, giving drivers the
  option to enjoy the open-air
  experience.
- 8. Continuation of Chassis
  Components: While the
  body and interior were new,
  the chassis components (including fully independent
  suspension and four-wheel



disc brakes) were carried over from the previous generation.

- **9. Multiple Engine Options:** The C3 offered various engine choices, including small-block V8s, big-block V8s, and high-performance options like the L88.
- **10. Sales Records:** The C3 set new sales records, with 53,807 units produced for the 1979 model year.
