We're excited to see the group's growth and, as those of us from SONHC already know, there is nothing quite like a Corvette caravan or the enjoyment of being out with others who share the same passion for these iconic cars!



Calloway Corvettes

One of the most iconic and influential aftermarket Corvette manufacturers in the world must be Calloway Corvettes, located right here in Old Lyme, CT. Since the mid 1980's, the Calloway name has been synonymous with creating the world's best aftermarket Corvette performance upgrades! Started in 1973 by Ely Reeves Calloway (son of Calloway Golf founder Ely Calloway) who first worked with BMW by adding turbochargers to the then-new BMW 320I. He went on to create performance upgrades to numerous car manufacturers such as Volkswagen, Porsche, Audi, and Mercedes-Benz. Back in 1987 Calloway convinced GM to let him create a twin turbo version of the new C4, that could be ordered and sold through Chevrolet dealerships using a factory standard RPO BK2. The car, better known as the "Sledgehammer," went on to set and hold the World Street Legal speed record of 254.76 mph until 1999! In the years since then, Calloway has continued to create a variety of specialty Corvette models, each with a variety of engine and car configuration options. There is now a C8 Calloway version that is one of the latest Corvette projects to come to life. SONHC actually has some member Calloway Corvettes in our group and they are very impressive when you see them up close!

Reeves Calloway passed away on June 11th 2023 at the age of 75 from injuries sustained in a fall at his home. But his company legacy and the incredible Corvettes they continue to produce live on.





ALIGNMENTS

One of the things that Corvette owners may not even be aware of that can affect them and their wallets greatly, is the importance of keeping their Corvette properly aligned. And while many people have heard the term alignments, many don't understand what they are. The first incorrect myth is you align the tires, which is incorrect. It's the vehicle that gets aligned and that is what effects the tires. In a nutshell, an alignment is just what the word implies: It's what keeps the car going down the road straight and handling properly, allowing the tires to roll in the same straight direction. Sounds simple; however, there's some serious math that goes into properly putting a Corvette into the correct alignment. A degree here or there can adversely affect how a car handles and how the tires wear. Tires for Corvettes are not

cheap, as a set of replacement Michelins run well over a thousand dollars (even with our VIP discount), so it makes sense we would want to do everything in our power to increase the miles you get from a set of tires.


Have you ever tried to balance a quarter on its edge? If you have successfully done that, you have aligned a tire a third of the way. You've achieved one of the three axes! The top of the quarter and the bottom of the quarter are exactly vertical — straight up and down!

Now a Corvette's suspension has three axes, and all must be properly aligned to minimize tire wear and give you the handling performance the car was built to have. Angles, called Caster, Camber, and Toe, all need to be in proper spec to achieve balance between tire wear and proper car handling.

Here's where it gets tricky: Not only does the tire have to roll straight and not skid as it rolls, but it must be put in position to react correctly when you turn the steering wheel or take a corner at even medium speeds. These cars are made to perform and, because of this, the alignment specs your Corvette should be set to are going to be different than the family SUV or other vehicle.

The Camber may be set differently to maximize handling and the cost of tire wear if you track your car

a lot. But for most Corvette owners, the street setup

LED Light Upgrades

One of the things that C6 gen and earlier owners can do to update the look of their car is to swap out some of the incandescent bulbs with newer LED bulbs. These bulbs not only have a more modern look with a brighter, whiter look, they last much longer than the older style bulbs. There are affordable kits available to swap out all the interior bulbs and even some of the exterior lights on a C6, C5, and C4 gen cars. The LED kits can be found on several of our *Partnering Professionals* websites, through Amazon or at most local automotive parts retailers!

Now that you know what an alignment is, how often should you get your Corvette aligned? At minimum, the car should be checked once a year. The good news is that with our relationship with our *Partnering Professionals* at VIP Tires & Service, you can get your Corvette alignment (or any household vehicle) checked for free! And if the alignment check shows it's out of the optimum specs, it's only \$89 to be adjusted and brought back into the proper settings!

Run Flat Tires!





ZP, RFT, SSR, DSST, ROF... These codes, and many more, designate a tire's design which the tire industry calls "Run Flat Tires." So, what is a run flat tire? Simply put, it is any tire designed to run for a short distance without any air in it! Most manufacturers use a 50-mile driving limit on the tires without air. Corvette owners should be familiar with this technology as every Corvette since the C5 generation has left the factory with "Run Flat" tires. Since there is absolutely no room to carry a spare tire in a Corvette (or the added weight), Run Flat tires are the natural answer to dealing with a tire puncture issue while out on the road without being stranded.

But this great technology does come with a cost. Many people feel the ride of the run flat tires is a much harsher and stiffer ride than with conventional tires due to the required stiffer sidewall design. In fact, many Corvettes owners do swap out their run flats for non-run flats to soften the ride of the car. But that's a debate for another article. Most all major tire manufacturers have a run flat version of the performance tires that are available for most Corvette generations, even going back to the C4 gen that preceded the standard run flat option.

Since Michelins have been the standard tire on the Corvette since the C6, the ZP (Zero Pressure) tire is available in all sizes and comes in both the run flat and non-run flat versions for those who prefer the softer ride of the conventionally designed tire. VIP Tires & Service gives all SONHC and SOMEC members the very best Michelin tire pricing available, regardless of the model tire you choose!

The Wright Museum of World War II is located at 77 Center St., in beautiful Wolfeboro, NH. The museum features over 14,000 items representing life on the home front and on the battlefield during WWII.

Before we went inside, we were treated to a behind-the-scenes look at a Stuart tank and a Pershing tank. The Pershing tank was on the bridge at Remagen — if only it could talk!

Our tour began with a short film about the museum and how it came to be.

May 30 Trip to Wright's WWII Museum

Tours are self-guided, but there are docents throughout to answer any questions you may have.

I found the "Time Tunnel" particularly interesting. Covering the years 1939 through 1945, it showed the shifting lives of Americans prior to their involvement in WWII and through the war. Just studying the covers of "Life" magazine showed an interesting perspective as rationing and Victory Gardens became a way of life.

Each room in the Time Tunnel had a sign posted with the financial impact of the war and the time period.

When you walk out of the Time Tunnel, you enter the Military Gallery filled with various vehicles and exhibits that told about the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard, and the role each branch played through the war.

I would definitely recommend a ride to Wolfeboro to enjoy this museum. Keep in mind that Wolfeboro is the oldest summer resort in the US, so traffic can be "interesting!" There is ample parking at the museum as well as a picnic area.

If you decide not to bring your lunch, I would recommend the Back Bay Boathouse on Mill St. for an excellent meal. You are offered the option of eating inside or outside, right on the water. Service is


excellent, as is the food (try their homemade potato chips).
