What Goes Into Choosing A Caravan Destination?

It's simple right? You choose a spot to meet and you find a place to visit. And you're off! Well... not quite.

Lots of questions have to be addressed for a destination to make it on the list of our possible journeys. So what goes into selecting a location to visit?

Choosing a destination is broken into two key areas: **Interest and logistics**. Obviously, is the location somewhere the group might find enjoyable and interesting? Is there an attraction at the destination? Is there something of historical significance to see or visit? Is there a natural visual element to enjoy?

New England has numerous historical and beautiful area's that on the surface would certainly qualify as possible caravan candidates. One could certainly throw a dart at a NE map and pretty much anywhere it landed could qualify for a potential visit.

But this is where the second — and equally important — criteria must be met in order for a location to be considered: The logistics of the trip, the nuts and bolts of how we get there! Most all of the boxes for putting together a trip to a certain location must be checked off in order for the destination to qualify as an enjoyable day! The more boxes we can check off, the better the trip.

A Must-Have Tool

This little baby, right, is a must-have for any Corvette owner. It will save you grief, aggravation, and can go a long way in helping keep you from damaging your car. Batteries are both heavy and awkward to handle. Removing a battery from a C7 is a total pain. With this inexpen-



sive tool (around \$20 at most automotive retailers), your aggravation will be a thing of the past as it allows you to both remove and install your battery in any generation Corvette. Installing and removing your car battery just got a whole lot easier by simply owning this nifty little gadget.

The logistics breakdown includes the following:

- First: choosing a starting point. The criteria for this falls into just a few categories. It must be large enough to hold the group before we start our journey. Next, can we get the group on the road with the least disruptions, i.e.... lights or a lot of turns to get to our designated route? And lastly, is it as centrally located as possible for everyone traveling to it. (This one is always tough as we know many travel a great distance just to reach the starting area.)
- Next: choosing our route. Are there enjoyable roads in good condition to get us there? We're always looking for the best possible back roads to take on our journey. Highways and traffic lights are not something Corvette owners typically enjoy. So we try to avoid them whenever possible. Does the route allow the group to be able to stay together? Are there area's that will most certainly break the group up, requiring us to stop and reorganize the caravan several times? (FYI, we know no one likes to sit on the side of the road waiting for the group to catch up.) So we've chosen both a starting point and plotted out our route to the final destination.
- "Pit Stops." Now we have to find pit stops along the route to satisfy our bladders. Depending on the size of the group and the length of the caravan, this can be one of the biggest challenges. How many stops will the journey require? The criteria we use for scheduling stops is to find viable locations within an hour-and-a-half, at the most, from our previous departure point. Does the stop have adequate parking to get the group safely in and out? Are the restroom facilities large enough to make for a quick group stop? (30 minutes or less is the guideline.) Are the owners amicable to our visit? (Dublin General store comes to mind.) How far out of our normal route must we go in order to find just the right place to create the stops. However, it's sort of a Catch 22 scenario, as the further off the beaten path we travel, the fewer the facilities large enough to handle a group exist. So we've found our starting point, our traveled route, and our pit stops.

- Food! Next up is where is the group going to eat? This subject alone is enough to drive one crazy. You'd think that any restaurant would love to have a large group come visit and spend money with them. After all, isn't that why they're in business? Well, having a large group walk through the door all at the same time isn't how most restaurants are built to work. Seating logistics, staffing issues (huge issue), enough cooks to turn out the food in a timely manner are all things our potential lunch or dinner host most often shudders at when we contact them to inquire about a visit. Experience tells us we'll often have to reach out to over a dozen potential destination restaurants before we find one that is willing to take on the task of feeding the group. And all this happens after we first narrow down possible restaurants based on their menu. So we found an enjoyable route to get everyone to the chosen destination, we found adequate places to stop along the way for pit stops, and we found a restaurant to feed us. Now what? Do we simply turn around and head back home? Sometimes we do, because the other element we haven't men-tioned is: Time!
- **Time.** Everything we incorporate into a trip must fit within a certain amount of time! We under-

stand that most caravan participants have constraints on how long they can or choose to be away from home. Pet issues, children issues, and just plain old fatigue all play a role in one's willingness to commit to coming along. One of the things we've learned over the years of doing this is that all caravan's can't be 8–10 hour marathons. Some of our trips, in fact a whole lot of them, must be on the shorter side time-wise in order for everyone to enjoy them. We've tried this year to incorporate more short trips into the mix of scheduled events, and we will continue to focus on this in the coming years.

In fact, in 2024, one area we will be emphasizing is creating short 2–3 hour events with a couple of the longer events anchoring the season at each end of the caravan season. We will always vary the destination of where our caravan season starts. But each year as we close out our caravan season, there are two trips that will always be on our season ending places to go: Bennington, VT, and our trip across the Kancamagus! Yes, they are marathons, but they are way too good to not enjoy!

So there you have it! An quick glimpse into all the required planning that goes into one of our caravan's!

Note: If you have an idea for a destination, think about all of these items. If your idea can meet the criteria, then send your idea to the group!

Did You Know...

We see the fantastic vanity plates on some SONHC members' cars. Some are downright ingenious and display their amazing personalized message for everyone to see. Did you know there is actually a website created by the NH DMV that you can use to create your own personalized plate. Not only will the site allow you create your vanity plate once you figure out what you want it to say, the site will also let you know if it's currently available in any of the different available plate categories. It will also give you notice if the state deems your plate design to be offensive or if its allowed (there is a list of non- allowed messages). But here is the warning: It is mesmerizing, as once you start, you'll be there for hours until you get it right!


