New Travel App: wanderlog

One of the things we've been trying to find for a couple of years now is a caravan and travel app that we can use to store the trip information directly on our phones.

We think we've finally found the best one. And it's a free download available for both Android and iPhone users. The app needed to be able to allow us to plan, schedule, include both our selected route with scheduled stops on a map, and then have it be sharable to everyone who is attending the event. This particular app will allow us to put check marks next to most everything we'll need to post the information on a particular trip. It will use existing map programs such as Google Maps or Map Quest. And it will show travel time, miles, scheduled stops along the way, and also give us all the ability to communicate with each other during our journey when radio communications are spotty or unavailable. (There will be an offline version available for a premium.) We're now testing the app and the initial results are promising. Hopefully we'll be able to announce the results at our Season Kickoff event in March and share the information so members will be able to download it and have it ready to use on our first caravan of the season.

Zora Arkus Duntov: The Godfather of Corvette

When something is around for over seventy years, there's most certainly going to be a lot of interesting history to look at. And no aspect of that history is ever realized without the people behind that 70-year history! There are numerous men and women who have played a huge role in the history of the Corvette: Harly Earl, Ed Cole, Bill Mitchell, and numerous others. But no name is larger than the name **Zora Arkus Duntov**!

Zachary Arkus was born in Brussels on Christmas Day, 1909. After spending many years in Europe, Zora, his bride Elfi and their families migrated to America to avoid Germany's advancing army. Zora and his brother Yura both were pilots in the French Air Force. While in Germany. Zora had received a degree in mechanical engineering that would play a huge


role later in his life. During his time in Germany, Zora wrote numerous articles on the advantages of four-

wheel drive and steering in racing cars.



Once in America, he and his wife started a company in NY called **Ardun Mechanical** that built Ford flathead engine heads to address the overheating problem they had during the war. Oh, and they also added 200HP to the engine's performance...go figure!

In 1953, while visiting the Motorama in NY City, Zora saw the prototype Corvette that was being



introduced to the public for the first time. He was so impressed with the car that he wrote a letter to Chevy's Chief engineer Ed Cole proposing a method to accurately calculate the top speed of cars. Cole was so impressed, he offered Zora a position as an Assistant Staff Engineer at GM. Fast forward a year and, with the introduction and later disappointing sales of the first year Corvette, Cole was ready to pull the plug on the Corvette project and discontinue production after just one year! Zora once again stepped in and wrote another letter to Cole, stating that the Corvette could secure Chevrolet's future by promoting the car to America's youth! Cole listened to Zora and the Corvette lived on! continued on next page

wing Green Plant Tours

The announcement came last month that the National Corvette Museum's Corvette production tours were being suspended in early February 2024. The reasoning was somewhat vague in its description: "Due to manufacturing advancements." One of the rumors swirling around is that the reason behind the pause in the tours is the plant is being retooled for the soon-to-be-released ZR1 model. In just a few short years, Cole saw the genius in Zora and would later go on to promote him to Chief Performance Engineer in 1968, which set the wheels in motion for the Corvette to become the world-class sports car it went gone on to become!

Zora developed just about every performance Corvette that GM ever built until the early 70s! He drove the first Corvette over 150 MPH and developed the cars racing heritage at Sebring and Daytona! He spent years developing cutting edge technology including the first ever mid-engine Corvette way back in the early 1960s. He, along with Bill Mitchell, would go on to build the Aero Vette II in the early 70s (another mid-en-

gine design) which proved the performance viability of a mid-engine designed Corvette! Because of Zora's early vision and expertise, many innovations remain to this day. Some of them include the Grand Sport model, the importance of an independent suspension, the introduction of the V8 engine in the Corvette, along with fuel injection, and many more ideas, and lastly the mid-engine C8 car!

These are just a few of the reasons he is known as **"The Godfather of the Corvette."**

A Base model? It's a Damn Corvette!

This exchange is one that takes place over and over again. Why? Well, just blame Chevrolet! It wasn't enough for them to turn out a car that has become a world-class sportscar! They had to continuously take it to a whole new level with variant models! Over the past 40 some years, Chevy has introduced numerous variants of the "Base Model." These started in the latter years of the C3 and with the introduction of "Special Edition" variants, such as the '78 "Indy Pace Car," and then again with the '82 and '96 "Collector's Edition" cars. Many of us remember the monster '90 ZR1 that changed the performance landscape with its introduction!

GM learned that, by developing these somewhat unique editions (BTW...many of these unique editions were produced in the 1,000s), it could both bolster the bottom line with the accompanying premium prices the cars carried and also create additional excitement for the Corvette in general! Time and time again, Chevrolet has introduced new buyer's options, beyond just a "Base" Corvette. The Grand Sport, the Z06, the ZR1, and now the E-Ray! There is no denying the fact that, with the introduction of each of the latest new model releases, Chevrolet has accomplished what it set out to do — to continue to attract a new Corvette audience. Just remember, for those of us who simply

Just remember, for those of us who simply wn a "Base" Corvette, our car has been the backbone of the Corvette line for over 70 years. So we shouldn't get upset when Chevy introduces the latest new variant, but worry that, at some point, Chevrolet stops producing a simple "Base Model."



When I was a kid, I remember enjoying a trip to the supermarket with my Mom. As soon as we hit the market's front door, I would jet off and head straight to the magazine racks that were the norm in every store. Magazines on just about any subject adorned these huge racks. There were numerous daily newspapers, crossword puzzles mags, *Life, US News, Sports Illustrated*, and literally hundreds of other magazines covering every possible subject!
