OUR SEPTEMBER FEATURE ARTICLE: THE MAKO SHARK'S

For those of us growing up in the sixties and seventies, both the C2 and the C3 Corvettes were considered the absolute pinnacle dream car that as kids, so many of us drooled and panned over. And, more times than not, we got our view of these incredible machines adorning the covers of car magazines. If we were ever so lucky to actually see one out in real life, we would fixate and just stare in admiration and perhaps dream... that just maybe someday!


Even fewer of us might have actually gotten a ride in one or two, which as a kid was a certain nirvana moment! With their amazing style and beauty, hidden headlights, swept back fenders and aggressive stance, they just looked for the time to be two of the most incredible iconic automobiles ever created. To some, these two particular generations are still the two most beautiful series of Corvettes ever produced!

And, a lot of the beauty of both the C2 & C3 started interestingly enough from a pair of concept vehicles built exclusively for car shows. The first one, that happened back in the late 50's that absolutely drew attention to the then not yet released but soon to come Corvette C2 gen was a concept vehicle called the Mako Shark! A car that could later on be best described as a 2nd gen Corvette on steroids! Most everything on this show car



was enhanced, and accentuated, from the curved bold body lines, to the hideaway headlights to the wild varied blue to gray custom color paint scheme on the body! The completely exposed exhaust of the car almost made it appear more of a Hot Wheels design than that of a real car!

This car's design was inspired by then GM head designer Bill Mitchell, who had gone on a fishing trip in the



Bahama's and caught a Mako Shark! He so loved the body lines and color of that Mako, he wanted to replicate the look and color of that sleek fish onto the new Corvette concept car! Mitchell set out with GM stylist Larry Shinoda on creating this wild concept that would later go on to strongly influence many of the styling features of the upcoming second generation C2, debuting as a 1963 convertible model!

Interestingly, many of the original body design lines from this concept car actually made its way over into the final production of the first year C2, something that rarely, if ever happens. Gone was the double bubble glass top, a feature that simply was unattainable to produce in mass quantities. The gaudy interior was also replaced with a more subtle working one. There were two of these original concept vehicles produced and were at the time not called the Mako shark, but instead called the XP-755 project. The Mako shark concept car made its public debut at the New York coliseum at the 6th annual International Automotive show in 1962 and was received with incredible interest and fanfare. People were shocked when later on, when the 63 model came out and was so close in resemblance and design to the original concept Mako show car. Fast forward to 1964 and the release of the second Mako Shark design, called the Mako Shark II... which also made it debut again at the International Auto Show,, first in NY then in Paris France. This second version of three futuristic looking concept vehicles would go on to help shape the C3 body lines and its release in 1968. Putting these concept vehicles next to the actual production models, it was clear that their design influence was immense as much of the designs truly did carry over into the end production models. There would also be a third design created later on better known as the Manta Ray, that was built on the legacy of the Mako II and incorporated the Chevrolet aluminum 427 Big Block engine! All of these designs were incredibly strong testaments to Mitchell & Shinoda, who were all behind the designs that constantly pushed the boundaries of the early Corvettes designs! Today all 3 of these cars reside at the GM Heritage Museum in Detroit, MI





Interesting side story: After Bill Mitchell returned for his initial fishing trip. The Mako he caught that day was taxidermied and mounted on a huge plaque on his wall behind his office desk. As the design of the Mako Shark concept vehicle progressed, Mitchell kept getting more and more frustrated with the paint engineers who could not get the color of the Mako show car to exactly match the color tones of the fish on his wall! After numerous failed attempts at getting the tones exactly correct and each time forcing them to start over. One of the engineers in the paint department came up with a somewhat devious but clever idea. One night he snuck into Bill Mitchells office and took the fish off the wall and then repainted the fish to match their last rejected color that they had put on the concept car days earlier. They then returned the now repainted fish back onto Mitchell's wall. A couple of days later they summoned Mitchell down to the paint spray booth to approve the latest configuration. The very same one he had rejected just a week earlier. Mitchell eagerly congratulated the engineers; telling them that they had finally gotten the colors correct on the car and it exactly matched the colors and tones on the now repainted fish! Mitchell only many years later, learned of the engineer's sneaky idea of painting the fish colors to match the already painted car!

What is a Dry Run and why we do them

There is a ten-mile stretch of road called VT Rt 30 just outside of Brattleboro Vermont. A beautiful stretch of main road that we use many times on our Vermont excursions coming back into NH. The Dummerston Covered bridge is a quick left just off this main highway. Another well



traveled mainstay in a lot of our Vermont return home journey's. Rt 30 is a particular stretch of road that we've literally crossed over 25 times in our club's five-year history, and is the very reason that over the past three seasons of events, for almost every one, we conduct something we called a Dry Run. And it is just as it implies... A complete pre-event day trip where we travel over each and every mile of roads that we will be bringing the group over on the day of the actual event. We do this with several objectives in mind, but one main objective is to ensure that the roads were going to ask everyone to travel over are in good to excellent condition.

There is other reasoning behind this dry run event, such as having the opportunity to meet with any restaurant or other stop including any hosts if we're visiting a destination. We check our anticipated times for the days event against what we post on the itinerary that follows to keep us on time during the day of the actual event. Depending up on the size of the group we will be

bringing on the event, it also gives us an idea where the groups will probably get broken up and helps us find the right area where we'll be able to safely pull over and regroup everyone back together. We also use this as an opportunity to check out parking for any of our stops, such as the kind of material, paved or dirt and the condition the lot is in and is it conducive to low slung Corvettes.

Sharon is constantly busy on the dry runs and always has her notebook out writing all the details down we'll use to fine tune the actual day. And it is most definitely a working day for her! Also prior to the dry run, we map out our route using Google maps and as effective a tool as this can be, it's far from perfect, so doing a dry run can either confirm the data we see or allow us to change our route based on real live conditions

we experience out on the roads. Finally, we will conduct the dry run almost always within the same week as the actual event, typically on Mondays, so we have as up to date information to work with as possible. So, to say a lot goes into these Dry Run is an understatement. However, on the flip side, it is an opportunity for just the two of us to share a day together in Vetty White, without any distractions other than what we're

seeing and noting, which is something we both truly enjoy. It is our time alone and is far

more relaxing than the actual day of the event when we're leading the oftenlarge herd behind us. So, think about this the next time you join us on a caravan event. We've already done it

once already before you drive one mile on that event! At the end of a season, we will have traveled literally double the miles of the entire event season!

No wonder Vetty has 111,000 miles on the clock.

The dry runs are also open to all of the Admins to come along and join us, or sometimes the Admins will do the dry run in lieu of us, if we have a scheduling conflict and they do an equally great job of mapping out our routes!

Oh and that stretch of Rt 30 just outside of Brattleboro... The day we went across it with 30 some Corvettes in tow back in 2023?

It had over 10 straight miles of unpaved, dug rough dirt road that they were preparing to pave the following week after our trip. And each Corvette that day was right behind us as we cringed over each and every mile of that stretch of torn up road, muttering to each other.... this dam construction has got to end just around this next corner!



A LOOK BACK: THE 2024 HART'S TURKEY FARM

When Novembers arrives, a couple of things are about to occur. One... Our cruise season comes to a rather quick close and the second... the Holidays are a fast approaching! So last year, we decided to incorporate the two! 


C8 Radiator guards... Absolute must haves!

When GM released the new C8 design back in 2019, it ushered in a whole new era of Corvette designs! Ever since Duntov pushed for the mid-engine layout way back in the early sixties, his concept for the ultimate Corvette performance model finally made its way off the design table and out into the real world! And consumers gobbled it up! This radical new design brought so many changes to the car that some purists screamed this was no longer a Corvette... at least until they drove one. Purists or not, the performance and looks of the C8 simply cannot be denied. It's a Corvette through and through...And it's design is here to stay even in the coming generations!

And, something that if you happen to be fortunate enough to own one of these incredible performance machines, you need to be aware of involves the cars cooling radiators. They are located very low to the ground on the front outer corners of the cars. (We won't even get into the additional radiators the Zo6 & Zr1's models have) And, these radiators are constructed primarily out of aluminum, due to the incredible cooling properties that this material has. It's light weight, extremely effective in dissipating engine heat. But they can also be very easily damaged, due to the softness of the materials that make up the majority of the radiator. And... in the case of the C8, due to its locations, they sit very close to the ground making them susceptible to all the debris of the road, such as rocks and debris kicked up by both followed and passing traffic!

Something smaller than the size of a penny absolutely has the potential to damage or even destroy one of these radiators in moment's notice out on the road. And, if this happens, you are going to be in a world of hurt! The cars built in protective alarm systems will shut your car down, as soon as the temperature rises above an unsafe level, which a punctured or damaged radiator will surely cause, leaving you stranded sitting on the side of the road... and in need of a tow! And, only remedy to fix this issue will be to have the radiator replaced. And at \$1500 each, that's when the real pain kicks in!



But this doesn't have to be a sky is falling moment. There are numerous companies that offer radiator guards that slip right over the radiators. They are extremely effective in adding a layer of impact protection, and are pretty affordable (Downright cheap when compared to a new \$1500 radiator) and some can actually add some cool esthetics to the cars look down low. They are available in a variety of differing styles from numerous sources. A couple of our Partnering Professionals companies have several styles available! So, the best advice..., is to deal with this issue now in your driveway, rather than later on while sitting stranded on the side of the road.
