This is why I can be friends with him and still continue our daily battles over our difference of opinions in cases."

The ending brought warmth and hope to my heart, and maybe this can to you as well. Further, as most of us know the next couple of months fly by with so many activities, parties, travel, and squeezing in a few cups of pumpkin spice coffee. In the midst of the hustle and bustle, let us remember to have love and kindness

in our hearts. As we celebrate those who walked faithfully before us and completed their race on All Saints Sunday on Nov.2 as well as the commitment and service of our veterans on Nov.9, perhaps all of their love and kindness can rub off just a bit on us. In fact, Gail B. recently said about Jerry H. "Jerry was a quiet, steady presence for all of us and he will be remembered for a long time." Yes, and in his own quiet manner showed love and kindness. Finally, let us not forget that around the corner we will all fall to our knees like the magi who gave thanks for the Christ child whose name is Love.
