ANNUAL ROAD TO REDEMPTION EXPUNGEMENT CLINIC

The Mobile Area Interfaith Conference (MAIC), in partnership with Legal Services Alabama and organizations like StandUp Mobile, conducted its annual Road to Redemption Expungement Clinic on April 18th to assist individuals in clearing eligible convictions from their records. Held at the Ben May Public Library in downtown Mobile, this free, community-focused event offered returned citizens one-on-one legal consultations, guidance on expungements and support with restoring voting rights. By helping participants navigate the legal system and remove barriers to employment, housing, and civic engagement, the clinic reflects MAIC's ongoing commitment to justice, dignity, and second chances for those seeking to rebuild their lives.

APRIL IS SECOND CHANCE AWARENESS MONTH!


