We also had peanut butter, jelly, bread, FRESH cheddar cheese, soup, and kid treats. All bags included flyers from the Monroe County job recruiters. Four lucky recipients received \$10 Starbucks gift cards!

Fund Drive Envelope Stuffing Volunteers Needed in November

As you probably know, most of the money we raise each year comes from our annual fund drive. We send out a flyer in the Fall to every address in Webster. This is handled by our printer and a professional mail house. We follow this up with a personalized letter to past donors who did not respond to the first mailing reminding them of our need for their donation. Setting up this mailing involves folding and inserting the letter in an addressed envelope, adding a return envelope and the flyer, and sealing the envelope. This is likely to garner us another \$20,000 in donations, so it is well worth the time.
