PRESENTATION: FIFA World Cup '26 – Houston Preparations Darryl B. Cherry

Darryl B. Cherry currently serves as the Intelligence Supervisor for the Harris County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. He is responsible for the oversight of the Intelligence Task Force (ITF), which consists of two analysts, Deputy Sergeants and Lieutenants of the various Harris County Constable Offices as well as personnel from the Harris County Fire Marshal and Sheriff's offices.

Mr. Cherry has an extensive background in law enforcement, intelligence and counter-terrorism investigations. As a classified officer, he served the Houston Police Department in various roles for over thirty five (35) years, the majority as a detective. The last seventeen (17) years of his career was in the Criminal Intelligence and Homeland Security Division. Detective Cherry served as the Security Manager of the Houston Regional Intelligence Service Fusion Center with oversight of a federally certified



secure facility maintaining classified Homeland Security information at the secret level. Detective Cherry served as an instructor at the Houston Police Academy for several years as well. Finally, before joining Harris County, Detective Cherry served as Special Deputy U.S. Marshal and Task Force Officer (TFO) at the FBI Houston Joint Terrorism Task Force. Detective Cherry holds a TCOLE Master Peace Officer License as well as a TCOLE Instructor License.

STATE UPDATES

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ)

1. TCEQ Updates

a. **GHLEPC Grant application** approval received – awaiting agreement.

The proposed public education and outreach initiative, titled "Keep Your Family Safe From Household Chemicals," The training will cover a range of important topics, including the promotion of Harris County's free Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility Disposal Services. This training will be delivered in-person and virtually.

2. Open Grants

- a. **Texas Natural Gas Vehicle Grant Program (TNGVGP)** provides funding to repower heavy-duty or medium-duty motor vehicles with a natural gas engine or replace vehicles with natural gas vehicles. Accepting applications for grants through March 4, 2025, or until all funds are awarded. https://www.tceq.texas.gov/airquality/terp/tngvgp.html
- b. The Governmental Alternative Fuel Fleet Grant Program (GAFF) provides funding to purchase or lease new vehicles that operate primarily on compressed natural gas (CNG),



- liquefied natural gas (LNG), liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), hydrogen (fuel cells), or electricity—including fully electric and plug-in hybrids. Accepting applications for grants through 5 p.m. CT, Feb. 5, 2025. https://www.tceq.texas.gov/airquality/terp/gaff
- c. New Technology Implementation Grants (NTIG) provide funding to assist in implementing new technologies that reduce emissions of regulated pollutants from facilities and other stationary sources. - d. **Emissions Reduction Incentive Grants Program (ERIG)** provides funding to repower or replace older locomotives, marine vessels, stationary equipment, or non-road equipment to reduce nitrogen oxides (NO_x) emissions in Texas. Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT)

Promulgation of Administrative Rules Under Title 43, Texas Administrative Code, and the Administrative Procedures Act, Government Code, Chapter 2001: Rules Adoptions a. Chapter 7 - Rail Facilities Amendments to §7.35, Hazardous Materials-Written Reports, and §7.36, Clearances of Structures Over and Alongside Railway Tracks (MO) adopts the amendments to §§7.35 and 7.36 concerning Rail Safety. https://www.txdot.gov/content/dam/docs/commission/2025/0130/11a.pdf



- 1. Section 7.35 requires railroads to annually report information about hazmat shipments to the department.
- 2. Section 7.36 implements Texas Transportation Code, Chapter 191, which provides standards to protect workers from hazards caused by unsafe proximity of structures near railroad tracks and authorizes the department to grant a request to deviate from a requirement of that chapter.

FEDERAL

EPA

- 2. EPA has announced a final rule requiring replacement of **lead pipes** with 10 years. (https://www.epa.gov/ground-water-and-drinking-water/lead-and-copper-rule-improvements).
- 3. **Tier2 Submit and CAMEO Data Manager Softwar**e Updates were released in early 2024. The official versions of Tier2 Submit 2023 and CAMEO Data Manager 4.3.0 for report year 2023 are now available on the EPA website.

Department of Transportation

January 2025: PHMSA published a rulemaking to increase civil penalties for violations of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR). HMR are a set of rules that govern the transportation of hazardous materials in the U.S. Penalties are now as high as \$100,000+ (was \$99,756) per day, per violation. Failure to provide hazmat training for employees now carriers a minimum fine of \$617 (was \$601) per day, per employee. https://www.phmsa.dot.gov/about-phmsa/hazardous-materials-training-requirements

Department of Homeland Security (DHS)

DHS released its 2025 Homeland Threat Assessment (HTA) in October 2024. The HTA identifies a range of threats to the United States, including domestic and foreign terrorism, and threats to critical infrastructure. Department of Labor (DOL)

Transitioning to Safer Chemicals: A Toolkit for Employers and Workers. NOTES: PHMSA Grant Status

Dear GHLEPC Membership,

We want to provide an update regarding the status of the payment for the *Pipeline Emergency Response Grant (PHMSA PERG 693JK323NF0001)* pipeline tabletop exercise and drill conducted September 25, 2024. We successfully completed all grant deliverables on October 26, 2024, fulfilling the project as outlined in the grant. *(See grant specifics below)*. However, despite our efforts, the payment has not been received.

We have taken multiple steps to resolve this issue, including sending follow-up communications and escalating the matter directly to PHMSA. We are continuing to push for a resolution. We want to ensure that everyone is aware of this delay as it affects our ability to close out this project financially.

On January 22, 2025, the GHLEPC leadership sent a "Request for Investigation into Failure to Pay Complaint" email to PHMSA. At this time, we are awaiting a resolution by PHMSA, with the State of Utah Fire Marshal Office (Primary Awardee) and Sanders Resources (owner of Buxus application and Awardee). We will provide updates as we receive more information. We are committed to ensuring this matter is resolved appropriately. If anyone has questions or would like further details, we are happy to discuss them.

Grant Deliverables as written in the grant:

The GHLEPC (subawardee) is to conduct ".... A coordinated community drill with the Greater Houston LEPC - This tabletop exercise will include the whole community, multiple stakeholders. This includes appointed and elected officials, business leaders, first responders, regulators, NGOs, schools, nursing homes, churches, health care facilities, and other key decision makers at the local, state, and national levels including tribal nations. Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) management will be used for this tabletop exercise.... Stages of the drill would include: Pre-tabletop drill planning, Scenario design, Logistics and Preparation, Exercise delivery, Analysis and After-Action Report..." (Source: Grant application Letter)
