Marla provided the following information to all attendees:

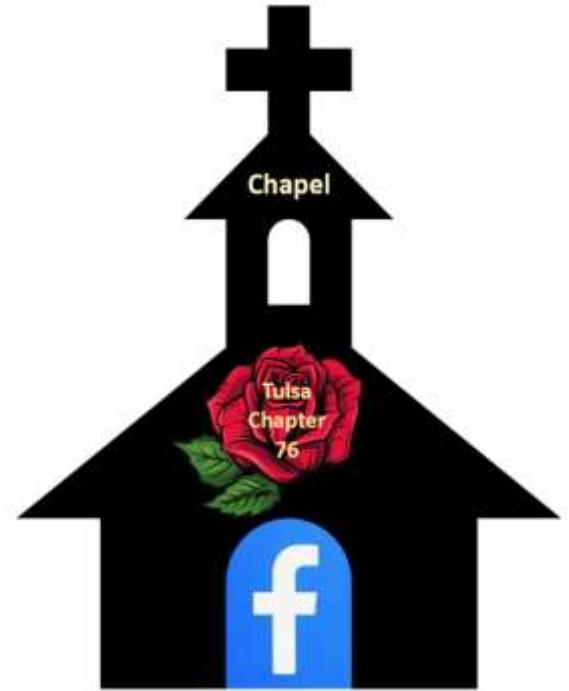
