# Driving in the Rain: Safety Tips

With the recent up-tick in rain, the Safety Committee wanted to share some tips on driving safely in the rain.

- 1. \*\*Slow Down\*\* Reduce your speed to maintain control and allow for longer stopping distances on slick roads.
- 2. <u>\*\*Use Headlights\*\*</u> Turn on your headlights to increase visibility for yourself and other drivers.
- 3. <u>\*\*Maintain Distance\*\*</u> Keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you to avoid collisions.
- 4. <u>\*\*Avoid Puddles\*\*</u> Steer clear of large puddles which can cause hydroplaning or hide deep potholes.
- <u>\*\*Check Wipers and Tires\*\*</u> Ensure your windshield wipers and tires are in good condition to handle wet conditions.
- 6. <u>••Stay Alert••</u>Pay extra attention to the road and other drivers, as conditions can change rapidly.
- <u>\*\*Avoid Cruise Control\*\*</u> Turn off cruise control to maintain full control over your vehicle's speed and response.

**Nominating Committee** – Paullei Tanner/Jennifer Cearley - A committee has been established to find nominations for the upcoming board. Each member is encouraged to sign up as a potential board member. The committee members will be making phone calls around <u>mid April</u> to encourage participation and to explain the roles of the various positions. This is an excellent opportunity to get involved. <u>In order to</u> become a President, President-Elect, or Vice-President, a member must have served on the Board for at least 1 year in some capacity.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

None.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

**Policies & Procedures:** The board was previously provided via email modifications to the Chapter's Policies & Procedures. Marla Carter recommended each member to become familiar with the documents. Paullei Tanner motioned that the revisions be approved as submitted. Jaylee Klempa seconded the motion. All <u>present</u> were in favor and motion passed unanimously. The approved Policies & Procedures will be signed and distributed to all members as an official document.

**Endowed Scholarships:** Paula Fennel explained the Chapter has one existing endowed scholarship: the Jean Harris Endowment with OSU in Stillwater. That fund has a requirement. The Chapter has been raising funds to increase the number of scholarships awarded. The Scholarship Committee has met with different schools to determine their requirements for new endowments. The following are the Scholarship Committee's recommended use of the scholarship funds that exist and that will continue to be raised:

- An endowed scholarship set up at OSU-IT, through the OSU Foundation. There is a requirement for it to be given
  as follows: 60% up front with the remaining 40% pledged to pay over the next five years. This will result in an
  award to one student each year. Once it's fully endowed, we can add money to it to raise the giving eventually to a
  double the award each year or two awards each year. The Foundation will choose the student based on our criteria.
  - Jaylee Klempa motioned that the recommendation be accepted. Paullei Tanner seconded the motion. Unanimously passed.
- TTC one time award to their Foundation (Tulsa Tech Education Foundation.) This will be awarded to five students by the Foundation, to be used on clothing, PPE, tools. The Foundation will choose the students, based on our criteria. We would like to repeat this award each year, if funds are available.
  - Kristi Ostler motioned that the recommendation be accepted. Jaylee Klempa seconded the motion. Unanimously passed.

- Central Tech one in Drumright, one in Sapulpa. A one-time award to their Foundation. This will be awarded to
  one student at each <u>campus at</u> by the Foundation. The Foundation will choose the students, based on our criteria.
  We would like to repeat this award each year, if funds are available.
  - Jaylee Klempa motioned that the recommendation be accepted. Cindy Nelson seconded the motion. Unanimously passed.

Christi Farr expressed awe and gratitude that this organization can do so much for the youth. Kristi Ostler noted that these endowments are why the Scholarship Fundraisers are so important.

New Member Installation: Paula Fennell installed 5 new members to the Chapter. Abigail Sullivan, Cindy Nelson, Jennifer Bouchard, Karley Potter, Kitzie Van Der Kooi, and Blue (as honorary member) were installed.

Industry Appreciation: Next month the Chapter will have the annual Industry Appreciation Meeting with awards. Members and 1 guest are free. Additional guests are normal rate per person. Jennifer Cearley is working on awards and a chance to vote on members to receive awards will be sent out soon. The goal is to show appreciation to members and member employers who have supported the efforts of NAWIC. Guests can be spouses, supportive friends, bosses, coworkers, etc. The event will be April 15<sup>th</sup> at the Tulsa Country Club.

**Construction Industry Outreach Committee**: Paullei Tanner noted that the Chapter previously had a committee that focused on outreach to local high schools and career tech programs, and planting seeds into the trade programs. The committee is being reinstated to allow more focus to be put on speaking to students on careers available to them, female empowerment in the industry, etc. There are several programs being implemented by ASA in the Oklahoma City market that include Construct My Future, Construction Rodeo, She Builds, etc. Paullei would like to see the Tulsa NAWIC Chapter bring some of that focus to Tulsa. Several high schools in the area provide technical training to students, and she would like to see NAWIC be more involved. If anyone is interested in joining her committee to assist with this, please contact her.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION - Jennifer Cearley presented the red rose to Bailey Martin for her involvement in all facets of NAWIC.

<u>PROGRAM</u> – PD&E teamed with Bailey Martin to provide training to the members on MS Excel. She provided data on a pizza <u>shop, and</u> worked through formatting cells and using pivot tables to sort and compile data. She was able to explain how the tables work to the advantage of the user.


