RED POWER ROUND UP REVIEW

The major activity Chapter 6 worked on for nearly 3 years finally took place on June 23-25 at the Clark County Fairgrounds.

The combination of good weather, large numbers of exhibitors, and literally hundreds of hours of work by Chapter 6 members & volunteers made it a very successful event.

THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2022 RED POWER ROUND UP

- On Wednesday, at the official opening for the Round Up, the Navistar/IH Truck plant that has been a fixture in Springfield of over a century opened its doors to a specific group to tour for the first time in many years. There was time and space to accommodate over 150 attendees who were divided into three groups for the tours. The first group was met and welcomed by the Mayor of Springfield, a State Senator, a State Representative as well as other local dignitaries. They officially welcomed the group and presented IHCC President Bob Buxton with an official proclamation recognizing the Round Up.
- This year, Ohio Chapter 6 presented a new category for display. It was titled “Heritage Tractors”. Any tractor that was purchased new and has remained in the same family for its entire life was eligible to show in this exhibit. Seventy seven chapter members from across the United States registered for the display. The club prepared a full-page historical narrative of each tractor and placed it in front of each one. Each entry was given a magnet for their tractor designed by The Heritage Center to designate it’s “Heritage” status.
- There were a total of six “primary sponsors”. They received that designation by agreeing to sponsor a specific event or location during the Round Up. The following is a list of the sponsors and the area each sponsored.

- Please take note of these sponsors and, if the opportunity arises, support their business and thank them for supporting the Round Up.
- Also this year, Chapter 6 and a Sponsor sponsored a Youth Tractor Restoration Contest for FFA & 4-H members to restore IH tractors and present them for judging. A total of six tractors registered and were judged by a panel of three judges. The judges not only critiqued the tractors, they also interviewed the members who had completed the work.
- There were 40+ “Outside Vendors” who participated. The availability of 200’ barns with fully concreted floors and side panels that opened the entire length of the building allowed us to offer these vendors inside space.

Several chose to take advantage of the offer and many positive comments were shared with the committee chair at the end of the event

- The “Inside Vendor” area almost enjoyed too much success. There were so many requests for booth space that the various committees had to work together to make room to accommodate everyone. Actually, some vendors who typically would be “Inside Vendors” agreed to move to the “Outside Vendor” area due to the availability of the afore mentioned barns. A total of 120 spaces were occupied in the main buildings. There were 35 vendors in the buildings with an additional 4 vendors who moved to the barns made available by the Outside Vendor committee.
- Activities for the kids included barrel train rides as well as related kids activities in the “train depot”. There were 320 riders on the train. There was a Kidde Pedal Tractor pull on both Friday and Saturday that attracted a large number of participants as well as their “cheering sections”.
- There were 239 campers on site. The number coming in to the grounds required working with the fair management to open additional spaces that were not included in the original grounds contract. Fair administration and employees were most helpful and accommodating.
- The entertainment featured a variety of acts that performed throughout the three days. One of the new things at this Round Up was having a nationally known band from New York/Nashville perform at night under the 300 seat entertainment tent that had professional sound and lighting. They performed everything from Waylon and Willie to Johnny and Jerry Lee.
- Some of the significant displays in the chapter building included the only known restored prototype cotton picker on a Farmall C, the cut-away Cub, the 501 Cub & 501 Cub Lo Boy. There were multiple IH Brass Cars and High Wheelers in another building, as well as other unique modified tractors and implements located around the grounds.
- There were eight educational seminars presented on a wide variety of topics. After making some adjustments to the sound system, things went well in the area.
- The registration process went well. The addition of a Courtesy Corps of 8-10 golf cart drivers who led each exhibitor to their area after registration was well received. Visitors who were checking in for camping and registering their personal golf carts could do all that in the same building which made for an efficient and smooth check in operation.
- The parking areas proved to be very adequate for even the largest crowds. The volunteers working that area, who were mostly young folks who volunteered, were kept very busy.
- The show book photography area was set up inside a newer building that provided drive through access for tractors and other items that were photographed. The photographer reported 298 photos were taken inside. Additional photos were taken outside of static displays and of equipment

- The merchandise sales area was a very busy place. The chapter sold literally tens of thousands of dollars' worth of items. One of the biggest sellers was special quilt fabric printed just for the Round Up.
- No one is certain how many tickets we sold on the raffle tractor, but it is safe to say there were a thousand in the drum when the winning ticket was drawn. The winner was from Ohio.
- Saturday, under the shade of the entertainment tent, we had the National Auction with all proceeds benefitting Chapter 6. The National IHCC meeting was also held.
- Lisa Merkle, the IHCC National Membership Secretary, has informed us that Chapter 6 is now the largest Chapter with membership around 540.

The 2022 Red Power Round Up was a success. Many positive comments and compliments were given both in person and on social media.

The reason it was a success is because approximately 100 Chapter 6 members stepped up and shared their time and talents to make it happen. Whether you chaired a major committee, volunteered during the event, served on the Steering Committee, helped pick up trash, announced the parade, etc., you are to be commended and thanked for your part in this successful event.

You can leave your trailer on the grounds if you so choose.

You will receive a free pass to the show.
