## Occurrence Synopsis:

Nipawin-Smeaton RCMP also responded to a variety of other calls for service. There was a total of **574** new investigations/calls for service during the month of **April**.

## Policing Priorities for the 2026-27 fiscal year:

After compiling the priorities provided by local RM’s, towns and villages, Nipawin RCMP has developed the following priorities for the 2026-27 fiscal year (April 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>).

1. Prolific Offender Checks: These have been the most effective pro-active crime reduction measures for Nipawin and actually right across the province. RCMP prioritize local offenders who are on court-ordered conditions within the communities and check on these offenders at their place of residence on a regular basis.
2. Police-Community Relations and Communication: In the past years, local RCMP have recognized tremendous success with their involvement in local school liaison programs and local community involvement. The Nipawin and Smeaton RCMP will also be once again encouraging the Police Observer Program, commonly known as “ride-alongs”. Local officials and leadership as well as potential RCMP recruits will be encouraged to participate in order to get first hand experience of community policing challenges and opportunities.

Throughout the year, different initiatives will be created and tracked to address the goals set out in each of these priorities.
