



# Policing Report – January 2026



During the month of **January 2026**, the Nipawin-Smeaton RCMP responded to and investigated the following occurrences in the **Nipawin / Smeaton** Detachment area. Charges are not typically laid in every instance:

### Occurrence Synopsis:

Nipawin-Smeaton RCMP also responded to a variety of other calls for service. There was a total of **438** new investigations/calls for service during the month of **January 2026**.

### Policing Priorities for 2025/26:

After compiling the priorities provided by local RM’s, towns and villages, Nipawin-Smeaton RCMP has developed the following priorities for the 2025-2026 fiscal year (April 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>).

1. Prolific Offender Checks: These have been the most effective pro-active crime reduction measures for Nipawin-Smeaton and actually right across the province. RCMP prioritize local offenders who are on court-ordered conditions within the communities and check on these offenders at their place of residence on a regular basis. When offenders are found to be breaching their conditions, RCMP obtain arrest warrants and then take these offenders before the courts.
2. Road and Traffic Safety: Local RCMP will partner with PA and Melfort Traffic Services to make regular patrols of the service area to increase the police presence and to enforce Provincial and Federal traffic statutes. This will all be done with the goal of increasing the level of safety for driver’s and users of Saskatchewan’s roads and highways. October we will be conducting Operation Overdrive across the province, focusing on impaired driving.
