Waler bills were due July 31 & penalties have been applied as of August 1.





Merry Christmas from the Nipawin and Smeaton RCMP detachments! As we prepare for another holiday season we want to remind everyone to make sure that they celebrate responsibly with festivities that end with everyone making it home safely.

During this season, the local RCMP will continue with their number one priority – that being road and traffic safety. We will be regularly setting up local traffic check-stops to ensure sobriety, seat belt usage, and to check for distracted driving. Plan for a safe ride home!

Secondly, local RCMP will be concentrating on public safety through the continuance of the prolific offender check program. This is where local RCMP make house-calls to those who are on court ordered conditions to ensure they

are abiding by their curfews and living by the conditions laid out for them by the courts.

Thirdly, RCMP will be extensively patrolling to increase the police presence in local residential areas as many people will be away from home in order to celebrate the Christmas holidays.

Typically the Christmas season means many people planning on being away from home for extended periods of time. There are some simple steps that can improve the security of your home and property while you are absent.

Sugar shortage? No problem!

Cream Cheese Turtle Cups

1 tube (16-1/2 ounces)



refrigerated sugar cookie dough 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened 1/3 cup hot caramel ice cream topping 1/3 cup chopped pecans 1/3 cup hot fudge ice cream topping, warmed 36 pecan halves

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Place cookie dough in a large bowl; let stand at room temperature 5-10 minutes to soften. Add flour; beat until blended. Shape dough into 1-in. balls; place in greased mini-muffin cups. Press evenly onto bottoms and up the sides of cups.
- 2. Bake 6-8 minutes or until edges are light golden brown. Press a deep indentation in center of each with the end of a wooden spoon handle. Bake 8-10 minutes longer or until golden brown. Cool in pans 5 minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool completely.
- 3. In a small bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy; gradually beat in caramel topping. Fold in chopped pecans. Spoon 2 teaspoons filling into each cup. Drizzle with fudge topping; top with pecan halves. Refrigerate until serving.
