INCOMING FRESHMEN TO TAKE PLACEMENT-SCHOLARSHIP TEST

These placement tests consist of three sections: I.Q., Stanford Paragraph Meaning (English) and Iowa Algebra Aptitude.

The total amounts awarded to the incoming Freshmen are equally divided to cover the 4 years of the student's career at Cardinal Dougherty. These scholarships have been provided for and are maintained by the Parents' Guild.



TRANSPORTATION LAW AMENDED CATHOLIC SCHOOLS BENEFIT

Governor Carey signed two amendments to the Transportation Law, last August, which benefit

parents of students in Catholic schools.

Of special interest to parents is the elimination of the term "nearest available" in regard to transportation to school. Now, students opting for attendance in Catholic schools will be furnished transportation by public school boards, so long as the parents reside within 15 miles of the school the

student attends.

Parents are reminded that the April 1 deadline for requests for transportation is still a part of the law. Many of the transportation problems result from parents not adhering to this deadline for request for transportation for their son.

ALCOHOLISM SYMPOSIUM TO HIGHLIGHT "CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK" AT C.D.H.S.

To highlight Catholic Schools Week, February 4-11, and as a follow-up to Dougherty's participation in the Diocesan Respect Life Day for High School Students, held last October, there will be an Alcoholism Symposium held at the school on February 6.

Mr. William P. Hull of Occupational Alcoholism Programs, Buffalo AFL-CIO Community Services Activities, will speak, show films, and discuss questions with students. Mr. Hull conducted a workshop during the Respect Life Day and his program was extremely popular among students from all schools in the diocese.

The symposium is being co-sponsored by the Religious Studies Department and the Student Council.

A FURTHER FOLLOW-UP ON THE STUDY OF CARDINAL DOUGHERTY

At the time of this writing (January 10), we have not received word from Bishop Head, as to his response to the Task Force findings, after studying the 14 diocesan high schools. Therefore, we do not know if, or to what extent, any changes will effect Cardinal Dougherty.

The following is information obtained by the Local Study Committee and shared with the Diocesan

Task Force:

The parental support at Cardinal Dougherty is very praise-worthy. The dedication of individual parents and the parents' Guild is evident in their successful activities and strong support of the school and its programs.

Examples:

1. For the 2nd school year in a row, Cardinal Dougherty has raised the highest amount per student for local assistance.

2. Over 60% of underclassmen parents responded to a parents' survey, and large numbers attended the two Town Meetings.

3. The school has a very active and dedicated Alumni Parents' Club.

4. The school has an active, hard working Bingo Association.

5. Parental support is aided by CDHS publicity and public relations, recruitment programs, and the monthly mailing of 1,400 copies of this newsletter.

6. Parental support is aided by the school's concern for its neighborhood and the Catholic parishes in Regions 1 and 5, evidenced by -

Hosting and attending Region meetings.
 coordinating and organizing of the 1st Annual

Track & Field Meet for the parishes of Region 1.

- hosting the Erie County Sheriff's Dept. and its
Drug Abuse Program for Region 1.

- sharing and hosting the Region 1 and Northwest Clergy Association's Lenten Series.

Concerning Enrollment Trends, the Local Study Committee learned that the service area of Cardinal Dougherty is listed as the most stable neighborhood composition in the City of Buffalo. This designation is from the City's official study of stages of neighborhood disintegration.

When the Local Committee studied the school's financial patterns, the following was learned:

Cardinal Dougherty has shown financial cooperation with the Diocesan Policy in regard to tuition collection. This has resulted in 99.1% tuition collection for 1976-77 and 97.5% tuition collected for 1977-78

For the 2nd year in a row, we have ranked 1st in locally raised funds, promised and paid to the Diocese for local tuition assistance. In 1976-77, \$122.23 per student was paid to the Diocese. This figure does not reflect the 2nd annual Tuition Drive which collected \$20,290 which was immediately paid to the Diocese in the form of individual receipts. In 1977-78, \$150.52 per student was raised, for a total of \$47,716.00.

Cardinal Dougherty has always paid the Diocese, in full, its commitments for local assistance.

The Local Study Committee studied the mission of the Catholic high school. The committee stated its belief that the mission of the Catholic high school is clearly stated in the pastoral document of the Bishops entitled "To teach as Jesus Did." In the setting of the Catholic high school, the message is to be presented in such a way that they can make a mature decision on the place of Christianity in their lives. The Educational Apostolate must be continued.
