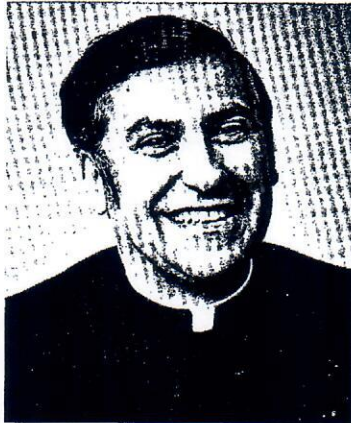
## FATHER GODBOUT IS NEW ASST. PRINCIPAL

### FR. ROWLAND IN GUIDANCE

Mr. Frank Strasser, Principal of Cardinal Dougherty High School has announced the appointment of the Rev. Aurele Godbout, C.J.M. as Assistant Principal and Dean of Studies, and Rev. William Rowland, C.J.M. as Assistant Guidance Director.

Father Godbout will replace the Rev. Marcel Poirier, C.J.M. who has been assigned to Notre Dame High School at Crowley, Louisiana where with the Rev. Paul Belliveau, C.J.M. they will inaugurate a new religion program for the Crowley school.

Father Godbout who is the Superior of the Buffalo Community of Eudists of the North American Province first came to Cardinal Dougherty in 1958. Since that time he has filled many teaching and administrative positions. For the last several years he has been an assistant Guidance Counselor in charge of Freshman and Sophomore Guidance.

Since 1968 he has been a member of the Provincial Council of the North American Province of the Eudists, having been re-elected in 1971. He was also

a delegate to the General Chapter meetings of the Eudists held in Rome, Italy and Medellin, Columbia.

Father Rowland, a graduate of the class of 1961, as Assistant Guidance Director replaces Father Godbout. He will direct the guidance activities for the Freshman and Sophomore students.

Father Rowland was ordained for the Eudists on April 11, 1970 and commenced work at Cardinal Dougherty the following September when he became a member of the Religion Department.

Very active in the school and the Eudist Community he has been Co-moderator of the Spotlight, Director of the Alumni Association, Frosh Cross Country Coach and a member of the school's Administrative Board.

In addition to his assignment in Guidance Father Rowland is also a teacher of Freshman Religion. He is currently engaged in working at Canisius College for his M.S. degree in Education.

The evening will afford area seventh and eighth graders the opportunity to visit Cardinal Dougherty H.S.'s facilities and also meet members of the teaching staff and student body.

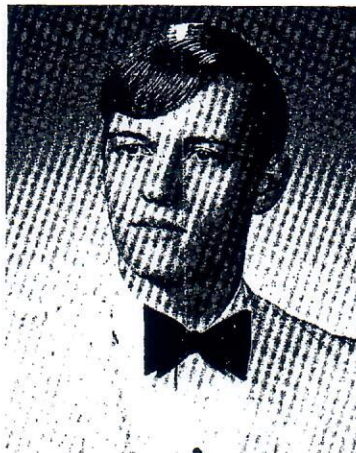
The students in attendance will also receive free tickets for the Dougherty-Turner football game, which is Eighth Grade Day at a Card football game.
