The Sawyer County Ambulance Service was invited to participate in the Trick or Treat activities at the LCO Head Start program and the Day Care on Halloween, Thursday the 31st. Rob Sparhawk and myself took our ambulance over to Head Start at 10 AM on that day to hand out trick or treat candy to the young kids. The only thing different this year, because of the rain/snow they had the event inside. This was the best move on their part. It would not have been any fun for the little ones to be outside like in the past years. With the number of Head Start kids and those that came from next door Day Care, we gave out candy to just over one hundred children. It was a lot of fun seeing all of the different costumes that the kids wore.

Later in the afternoon I moved the ambulance to the parking lot located behind the Fransen Bank on Dakota Ave. Mark Gritzmacher and myself participated in the annual Trunk or Treat event which started with that name when we had to deal with COVID. We just put candy in the trunk of a car as it drove down Main St. This was the safest way, back at that time.

This year's event was organized and sponsored entirely by the Wesleyan Church. Pastor Oetken is the pastor who works with Children and Family at the church. She is responsible for all the challenging work it takes to organize an event like this. There were many volunteers at the church that helped Pastor Oetken. This year there were approximately 1021 young people who attended the Trunk or Treat event. The event started at 4 PM and continued until 6 PM. The Church had twelve sponsors who donated \$150 each for sponsorship. This money helped offset the expense for additional candy that the church gave out to the many businesses, Law Enforcement, EMS, Fire, and other individuals who participated. When someone ran out of their supply of candy there was always someone coming by from the church to restock our supply. Many participants bought several dollars' worth of candy, but when you are giving it out to over one thousand kids it does not go far. Thanks, Pastor Oetken, for looking out for us.

Last Tuesday October 29th it was such a beautiful day I had to go out fishing. My friend John Myhre called on that morning and had the bug also. At 1 PM I met John at his home on Moose Lake. The crawler was not producing the action that I wanted so I switched to Berkly Gulp 2-inch fish fry. Boy did they like that. I caught nine crappies on the same piece of bait before I had to replace it. Tough piece of artificial bait.

It was a fun afternoon just enjoying the sunshine with temperatures in the mid 70's and catching close to fifty fish. John brought home about twelve fish. I did the catch and release thing. It was a temptation to keep some of these 11-inch crappies, but I said to myself no, maybe another day. I guess the fish that I

caught, you can say it was their lucky day. We will get back here one more time before the boat has to be put away for the fall.

Just a reminder that the fire danger today Saturday the 2nd is low. One thing to remember is at this time of the year the fire danger can change very quickly. Some wind and sunshine can get the danger up to high overnight. Check with the Wisconsin DNR before you even think of doing any outside burning. If you start a wildfire, you are responsible for all expenses of extinguishing that fire.

The Sawyer County Ambulance Service and the Town of Round Lake Fire Department / First Responders have received permission to use a newly built Helicopter landing area located one tenth of a mile into Ashland along Hwy 77. I spoke to Town of Gordon Town Chairperson Doug Thorp a couple of weeks ago about using this landing zone in case we have a life threating injury to a person in that area. If we need to transport the person by helicopter, we now can land the helicopter at this landing zone as a pickup location. This is the quickest way to get them to a Level 1 Trauma Center, either in Duluth or Eau Claire.
