In southwest Alaska we dined with Jerry Jacques, a well-known Alaskan author, lodge owner and bush pilot.

Across North America 6 species of fish were caught. Time was spent in the northern Alaska Brooks Range, southwest Alaska in the Lake Illiama area (Alaska's largest lake), northern Yukon, northern Northwest Territories, Great Bear Lake, and Lake Athabasca.

We had numerous encounters with Brown Bears and enjoyed epic site seeing. The people we met along the way were always helpful and somewhat in awe of our travels.

We also had offers to shoot Moose with the natives and have been invited back for ice fishing and the Caribou migration. I have done an Alaska flying trip 5 times and every trip meets all superlatives; this was no exception.

The next camp we went to was Smooth Rock. This camp is located about 15 minutes by air from Rock Cliff. We do about the same thing at each camp except we had no construction projects at any other camp. We spent about one day at each camp to get everything done that was needed. Some of the camps needed a little more work done than others so we did spend two days at some of the camps. Of course, Mike's helpers wanted to do some fishing also so we did take time so they could wet a line.

We had two cabins that we were going to clean but not shut down because there was a group of four coming in for a year end moose hunt. Oliver Lake was the camp that this group was going to stay at. They hunted there last year and had good success. They wanted that cabin again for their hunt. The other cabin that was not going to get shut down was Coles Lake. We also had a Moose tag. This was also going to be our year end fun. I have done the year end moose hunt with Mike three times. And it is a good time. I do more fishing than moose hunting but no matter what I do it is exciting.
