The Fire danger has gone back up to High as of this past weekend because of the high winds the relative humidity has dropped to 18 to 25 % throughout northwest Wisconsin. When the wind increases in speed and the relative humidity lowers the fire danger increased rapidly. Hopefully, Sunday evening April 18th we will have gotten some rain which will lower the Fire danger. This time of year, the fire danger goes up and down like the thermometer. Rain one day with wind the next. This rain that falls one day can almost dry out overnight. This dead grass that is exposed can then ignite very rapidly. I ask you to be careful until everything greens up which may take two to three weeks.

Don Rossiter informed me that the Moose Lake clean up went very well last Saturday. There were approximately 7 crews that were spread out over the area. A good share of the area was not too bad as far as wastepaper, cans, and bottles. Everyone met at Louie's at 9 AM and by noon things were completed. Outdoor writer Steve Suman states that when fishing for "Largemouth bass relate to vegetation throughout the year and depth is dependent on where you find grass. Coontail and milfoil grass around structure such as wood or near points are good staging areas. Lures that mimic baitfish, such as spoons, swimbaits, and spinnerbaits, will produce.

"Smallmouth bass are near similar types of structure and rock. Crankbaits and other lures that mimic baitfish are good options this time of year.

"Crappies are still mostly in 20 feet in the main basins, with no reports of them moving shallow just yet. Jigs and minnows, Beetle Spins, and small jigs are the current favorites.

"Bluegills mostly remain in about 20 feet in the main basins and anglers report success with worms, ice fishing tackle, and small jigs such as a Bimbo Bugs.
