It was only about 4-5 inches thick, so it broke up very easily. Within a couple of hours all the ice chunks had disappeared. Thanks Joel.

I talked with Frank Leuschen last Sunday afternoon. Frank as most of you know is our Dam Keeper. I asked Frank about closing off the gates so the water levels on Moose Lake can start to rise. He said he was waiting for this last piece of ice to melt and then he would close the gates. I'm sure when he checks the lake for ice on Monday morning the (20th) he will see that the ice is gone. He may then start the process of filling our lake back to the summer level. In the past Frank normally had Moose Lake filled to full pool by the fishing opener. This year the fishing opener is Saturday May 2nd.

I have not had any time to check by the Pine Point bridge to see if the walleyes are spawning. In the past years this is the prime time for this to start happening. Water temperature amount of daylight alone with other factors tells these fish that now is the time to drop your eggs. Let's hope for a good hatch this spring.
