We encourage everyone to attend the meetings and join the discussions if possible. We strongly urge the public to provide input through the online tool if possible. This allows us to more efficiently utilize limited funding to gather your feedback and will help us expedite compiling the results.

In addition, the public will have the opportunity to weigh in on new conservation issues of statewide significance that were brought to the attention of the Conservation Congress through the citizen resolution process prior to Feb. 26. The citizen resolution submittal period is now closed for 2024.
