Musky fishing at its finest, that is what was happening all over our area this past weekend. Oct. 1-3 the Hayward Lakes Chapter of Muskies Inc. hosted its 43rd annual catch and release Musky tournament. The tournament was open to anyone who wanted to fish any of the seventeen designated lakes in our area. A 2021-1725 Lund Pro Guide boat and trailer given away to one of the lucky 441 anglers in a drawing. This was a main attraction for these anglers. The boat is equipped with, a 60 HP Mercury motor. This boat was won by Heath Hoover of Shell Lake. This was just a drawing where everyone had a chance to win. You did not have to catch a musky either, to qualify.

Matthew Alberts of St. Paul had the highest score during the tournament & won first place. He caught three muskies one of which was forty-six inches in length. Matthew was fishing on Teal Lake. He was awarded a \$1500. gift card from Cabela's. Second place went to Eric Andracke of Bloomington III. He won a \$1000. Gift card from Hayward Bait and Tackle. Eric was fishing on the Chippewa Flowage. There were thousands of dollars in additional prizes given away. Nick Mathews of Ottawa Illinois was fishing on Moose Lake. He caught a beautiful 41-inch musky. Nick placed 15th with his fish.

I would like to inform everyone that it's that time of the year when many restaurants / businesses reduce their hours of business. A few weeks ago, we reminded everyone that Mel's Outdoor Power is staying open to shrink wrap boats and pontoons. Service work will be on a day-to-day basis. This Thursday morning the 7th of October the MLIA Board of directors will meet to discuss its monthly business. One item of business that we will be talking about is the possibility of stocking crappies in Moose Lake. The population of crappies has possible been reduced below what we would normally like to see.

There has been an extremely large numbers of vacationers in the hayward Lake's area during the past two summers. This has put additional pressure on our fishery. It's estimated because of COVID 25 to

30% more anglers & vacationers that normally go to Canada now have explored northern Wisconsin and Northern Minnesota. Many people that have not fished or used our outdoors before, are now using our natural resources. With the additional pressure we are possible losing as much as 25% more fish through legal harvesting. I personally would like to see our crappie harvest reduced to five crappies a day of which only one can be over twelve inches. The remainder for the total of ten must be bluegills or perch. Moose Lake residents should self-manage, of what they take. I am proud to say of 19 years of fishing Moose Lake I have never kept a fish out of Moose Lake. I repeat never kept a fish out of this lake. If I wanted a meal I would harvest my fish from other area lakes. I always wanted to put the fish back so my guests would have one more fish to catch.

Sunday night I spoke to retired Fish Biologist for the Wisconsin DNR Frank Pratt. What I have just been talking about was the topic of our discussion. Frank totally agrees with this. We also talked about the stocking of extended growth crappies. Crappies of about 6-7 inches. He did not think that stocking crappies from another source would mess up the genetics, but he did not know for sure. He said I really don't know. Most crappies that are in our lakes are not native. Most of the black crappies in our area lakes were brought in from along the Mississippi River south of here. The DNR brought them up here in railroad cars when they had to be moved in an emergency because low water in the back waters along the Mississippi many years ago.

Another thing we talked about was shallow water cover along the shoreline of Moose Lake. He said we can never have to much wood. We need more cover. Tree drops on Moose Lake would be the best thing we could do. The DNR dropped over nine hundred trees recently on the Chippewa Flowage. Frank said about 100 years ago many of our lakes had on an average, 300- 500 trees for every mile of shoreline. That was some of the best habitat that there ever was on our area lakes. It is now all gone. Why? Property owners. Let us start to improve this lake, Moose Lakers. We can do it.

This is Fire Prevention week. Please change your batteries in you smoke detectors and CO alarms. We will have much more next week.
