


May and June are primarily known as "family" months. These are months where we celebrate Mother's Day and Father's Day. These are months when families gather for graduations, weddings,

All Children's Academy (ACA) had a great year on our campus with 50 students enrolled. Enrollment for the new school year, starting August 18, is open. Classes are K-8th grade. 

Fear is a powerful emotion. It can paralyze us, steal our peace, and distort our perspective. Whether it's fear of failure, rejection, the unknown, or even fear of not being enough—we've all experienced its grip. But Scripture reminds us that fear is not the language of God's Kingdom. Instead, *love* is.



There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment.

The one who fears is not made perfect in love. I John 4:18

This Scripture offers us a radical truth: God's perfect love *drives out* fear. This isn't a gentle suggestion—it's a powerful promise. The kind of love God gives doesn't coexist with fear; it *displaces* it. Why? Because His love assures us that we are safe, forgiven, and deeply known.

In a world filled with anxiety and uncertainty, it's easy to let fear creep into our hearts. But when we rest in the knowledge that we are loved by a perfect, holy, and faithful God, fear loses its footing. The more we dwell in His love, the more we experience peace—not because our circumstances always change, but because our confidence in His love becomes unshakable.

So, how do we become "perfect in love"? We abide in God, we trust Him daily, and we allow His truth to redefine our identity—not as people defined by fear, but as beloved children of the Most High!

JOIN ME IN PRAYER: Heavenly Father, thank You for Your perfect love that casts out fear. In the moments when anxiety rises and doubt creeps in, remind us of the security we have in You. Teach us to rest in Your love and allow it to shape our hearts, our minds, and our responses to life's challenges.
