

**ACCOUNT OF THE WITHDRAWAL/TRANSFER OF THE FOSTER CHILDREN
FROM THE DUNN HOME:**

On 8-14-98 around 4 PM, Mr. Yamamoto and Mr. Hernali contacted the certified homes of Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] respectively to receive transfer placements for the four children in question from the Dunn home. Daniel and William M. [REDACTED] along with Pablo S. [REDACTED] would go with the [REDACTED] home and Cindy H. [REDACTED] would go with the [REDACTED] home. Both certified homes agreed to the arrangement.

Mr. Yamamoto and Mr. Hernali arrived around 5PM at the Dunn home, having informed Mr. and Mrs. Dunn to prepare at least emergency clothing bags for transfer for all four children to last at least 3 to 4 days. Upon arrival, all four children were prepared with clothing bags and informed by Mr. Dunn of the necessity for their withdrawal from the home. Pablo S. [REDACTED], Cindy H. [REDACTED] and William M. [REDACTED] expressed their displeasure (by statements and some tearing) at their withdrawal

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from the Dunn home. Daniel M. expressed no regrets about leaving and even stated he was glad to leave because he knew he was not wanted in the home. It is to be noted that Mr. Dunn had called into the FFA office earlier on 8-14-98 and indicated to Mr. Yamamoto that Daniel was too disruptive in the home and gave a 7 day notice to the agency for Daniel's termination from it.

Unexpectedly, William M. refused to leave the Dunn home and efforts at talking to him to leave voluntarily were failing. Mr. Yamamoto, after extended talking to William decided to attempt to pick up William and transport him to the waiting car of Mr. [REDACTED]. William struggled and resisted getting into the car, at which point Mr. Yamamoto ceased and desisted from further attempts at transferring William. During this episode, Mr. Dunn appeared upset, angry and expressed his anger and dissatisfaction verbally to Mr. Yamamoto, stating that ".....its not okay for me to handcuff the children but its okay for you (Yamamoto) to try to force the child (William) into the car and possibly hurt him in the action..." Mr. Dunn stating.... "Well, I think that is really unfair and this whole thing is unfair...."

Mr. Dunn indicated to Mr. Yamamoto that he was filming this episode on videotape, showing his video camera to the agency social workers and stating that "....if there were injury to his reputation or child care business, that the PAO FFA would have to answer for this." He stated that "...I'm going to hold you (Yamamoto), and Diane Prosser (agency director) accountable for any damages."

Mr. Hemali attempted to calm Mr. Dunn down and suggested that Mr. Dunn quiet his rhetoric and come away from the scene. Mrs. Dunn's mother, Paula B., was present at this episode, and was requested by Mr. Hemali to talk with William to persuade him to leave the Dunn home voluntarily to avoid the necessity of calling the police to escort him to the Jamison shelter for children because the agency decided he could not safely stay in the Dunn home.

Mr. Yamamoto decided to call the Bakersfield police to assist in intervention for William M. to extract him from the Dunn home and escort William to the Jamison Center if needed. Mr. Yamamoto also thought that intervention by the police was advisable given the angry, somewhat hostile display of Mr. Dunn towards the agency social workers who came to pick up the children. The police arrived on the scene about 15 minutes later, interviewed Mr. and Mrs. Dunn and Mr. Yamamoto about the situation.

After coaxing from Mrs. B. to William M., William agreed to go voluntarily with the foster family of [REDACTED], with the understanding that he might return to the Dunn home after a CPS investigation was conducted. The police were satisfied that legal procedures and protocol were being followed in this episode and that the children were being removed from the Dunn home legally after conversation with Mr. Dunn and Mr. Yamamoto. Police left without incident or filing a police report. All four foster children were transported to the respective certified FFA homes of Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED].

POSITIVE ATTITUDE OUTLOOK, INC. FFA AGENCY INTERVIEW WITH MR. DUNN:

On 8-17-98, an oral interview was conducted around 10 am. with Mr. Greg Dunn (note: Mrs. Sheila Dunn was unavailable due to a pre-arranged surgical operation she was having that day) interviewed by the following agency staff: the agency Director Diane Prosser, and Mr. Eugene Yamamoto, Mr. Omar Hemali, the investigating agency social workers who conducted initial
