To Love Your Neighbor, Know Your Neighbor features:

- A moderated question and answer session with all questions in writing
- Three religions chosen by the hosting community
- Nine religions available for your selection
- Experienced leadership of religious presenters
- Lively discussion of religious beliefs and practices

This program to address the widespread illiteracy about our world religions is part of CCIU's core educational mission, and is a collaborative effort with the host community. No fee is involved. CCIU encourages the host's local efforts to publicize the program. Religions can include any of the nine represented by CCIU: Baha'i Faith, Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Jainism, Judaism, Sikhism, and Unitarian Universalism.
