Operator Safety Guidelines- 1 operator/ attendant required

The Operator/attendant must be present with this unit at all times during use

Safety rules for the operator/ attendant

- Keep age and size of riders comparable. Extra caution is needed for children ages 3 and under. Never allow older kids to bounce with children 3 and under.
- Prior to entry, riders must remove shoes, jewelry, eyeglasses, hairclips, buckles, purses, pens and any other sharp objects that could damage the ride.
- Anyone whose weight exceeds 250 lbs is not permitted to ride.
- Number of riders should be limited 10 and 1000 lbs max (min 36" tall)
- Absolutely no pets are allowed on or by the unit at anytime
- Do not allow climbing on the unit or netting by anyone
- Do not allow anyone to jump on the unit neat the door
- No flips, wrestling, diving or extreme horseplay is allowed while on the ride
- Do not allow riders to bounce within four feet of each other
- No food, drinks, gum, candy, confetti or trash in or around the unit
- Do not allow silly string in or around the unit because it will damage the material
- No one is allowed to ride while the unit is being inflated or deflated
- Do not spray water on the ride for any reason
- Do not use if winds are in excess of 15mph (moderate breeze—tree branches move and paper needs held down). Riders must exit promptly and unit should be deflated
- Do not allow anyone to play near or around the blower unit
- Stakes should be checked regularly to verify that they are tight
- Blower should be checked regularly to verify that no excessive leaking is present
- Riders should always exit the ride feet first
- Absolutely no diving
- Be aware and familiarize yourself with the additional signage present on the unit

Emergency Evacuation

It is not uncommon for a ride to lose power or the blower tube to disconnect from the blower. In either case, and evacuation must be performed. The operator/attendant must...

- Stop patrons from jumping
- Instruct them to calmly exit the unit from the door or an emergency hatch (if present)
- Assist in the exiting by helping them out and holding the exit flap open
- Use common sense and consider this a guide only

The cause of the interruption should be fixed before resuming play

If the evacuation was due to wind, you should deflate the ride and not inflate it until the wind has calmed.

Children's safety depends on the presence of a trained, responsible operator/attendant.

I understand the responsibilities expected of me as the operator/attendant and will enforce these rules. I also verify that I've been read these rules and had the opportunity for further explanation of anything unclear.
