## Clean club update

We have been on our journey with Yachting New Zealand Clean Club programme for awhile now. This winter we submitted our report on what we've been doing to make a difference in our community and for the ocean. This includes using reusable kitchen plates etc. during shared meals, splitting our waste streams (recycling and chicken scraps), locally sourced seafood and potluck for our events (reducing plastic), reducing energy use in the off season, paperless communication (where appropriate), repurposing old sails into new creations, having a guest speaker sharing her academic

knowledge on the voyages of Tohorā and we encourage collecting rubbish when found in the harbour. We have now been recognised for our efforts and awarded our first star! This season we will be installing rat traps in the yard and we hope to install a visual icon for our boat wash down drain. If you've got ideas of what BYC can do as a club to do better environmentally, talk to your Clean Club reps, Keith and Grace.
