This report was written in accordance with Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Standard 115.388 Data review for corrective action.

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PREA Standard 115.388

The Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) was established to address sexual abuse and sexual harassment of persons confined to correctional facilities. Standard 115.388 Data Review for Corrective Action of PREA, requires that all public and private institutions that house adult or juvenile offenders review data collected and aggregated on an annual basis in order to assess and enhance the effectiveness of its sexual abuse prevention, detection and response policies, practices and training, including identifying problem areas; taking corrective action on an ongoing basis; and preparing an annual report of its findings and corrective actions for each facility as well as the agency as a whole.

Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter contracts with the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services and also the Louisiana Office of Juvenile Justice to house their youth. The facility also accepts youth for placement from all areas of the state.

Key Terms and Definitions

NONCONSENSUAL SEXUAL ACTS – unwanted contact with another resident or any contact with staff that involve contact with the penis and the vagina or anus; contact between the mouth and the penis, vagina, or anus; penetration of the anal or vaginal opening of another person by a hand, finger or other object; and rubbing of another persons' penis or vagina by a hand.

ABUSIVE SEXUAL CONTACT – Unwanted contact with another residents or any contact with staff that involved touching of the residents' buttocks, thighs, penis, breast or vagina in a sexual way.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT – Repeated and unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one resident directed toward another.

STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT – All incidents of willing and unwilling sexual contact with facility staff, and all incidents of sexual activity that involved oral, anal or vaginal penetration.

STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT – Repeated verbal comments or gestures of a sexual natures to a resident by a staff member, contractor or volunteer including demeaning references to gender, sexually suggestive derogatory comments about body or clothing, or obscene language or gestures.

2018-2019 Comparison of PREA Allegations

This report includes a comparison of calendar years 2018 and 2019 data on sexual abuse and sexual harassment allegations and provides an assessment of Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter's progress in preventing sexual abuse and sexual harassment of its residents. This review included a review of data from all available incident reports, grievances and investigations.

Comparative Analysis

Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter has seen a decrease in the categories of reported PREA allegations from 2018 to 2019. Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter will continue its efforts in ensuring that residents, staff, volunteers and contractors are educated in the agency's Zero Tolerance policy, as well as the several methods of reporting allegations. Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter is committed to ensuring continued compliance with PREA Standards as well as the health and safety of the residents in our care. A comparative analysis of 2018 and 2019 data indicates the following:

- There were **no** reported incidents of non-consensual resident-on-resident non-consensual acts in 2019. This is a decrease from 2018 where there was one reported incident that was substantiated.
- There were **no** reported incidents of resident-on-resident abusive sexual contacts. In 2019. This was a decrease from 2018 where there was one reported incident that was substantiated.
- There were **no** reported incidents of resident-on-resident sexual harassment in 2019. This was a decrease from 2018 where there was one reported incident that was unsubstantiated.
- There was **no change** in the number of reported allegations of staff-on-resident sexual misconduct. Both in 2018 and 2019, there were zero reported allegations.
- There was **no change** in the number of reported allegations of staff-on-resident sexual harassment. Both in 2018 and 2019, there were zero reported allegations.

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2019 Corrective Actions

Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter took preventative steps toward ensuring improved safety measures for its residents. In 2019, Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter implemented the following actions:

- Ensure all staff, volunteers and contractors have received PREA training.
- Offer PREA refresher trainings throughout the year.
- Ensure that all staff complete online Mandated Reporter Training through the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services website.
- Ensure all youth are given refresher trainings on PREA.

2018 Corrective Actions

Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter took preventative steps toward ensuring improved safety measures for its residents. In 2018, Johnny Gray Jones Youth Shelter implemented the following actions:

- All staff participated in online Ethics training through the Louisiana Ethics Board.
- All staff participated in and completed online Mandatory Reporter Training through the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services website.
- All staff received additional PREA training focusing on LGBTQ communication.
