A Note from Pastor Prentice...

Two wonderful Christmas Services were not the entire climax of the total account. Sure, in a secular world, trees and decorations are coming down; some gifts are even being sent back to "get the right one". So to many, Christmas is over, yet to the Church, it continues on; in reality, there is just too much good news for one day. Christmas actually lasts twelve days and moves to January 5 (hint, the decorations will stay put at Church until then). During this time, the early moments in Christ's life are depicted. We celebrate St. John the Apostle and Evangelist on the 27th. We remember the Holy Innocents and Martyrs on the 28th (when evil King Herod tried to kill Jesus). On January 1st, Jesus is circumcised and named. Finally, on January 6 we move on and celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord; this is when Jesus, true God is now revealed not just to Israel, but to the entire world. The Magi, Gentiles (non-Jews) from the east came to worship God, and with that moment, Jesus and the Message of the Good News of Salvation came to all mankind. God is no longer in a temple or a mountain, etc., God is flesh and bones. Yes, a powerful mystery that unfolds again for us. As we mature in the faith, I pray this becomes even more joyful. It is time to reflect on the year at Faith, where we are going and where we came. I give you some bullet points for thought:

- Seeker's Service we tried a more informal setting once a month at 11:30 a.m., but no takers; so this option will be abandoned. Options are being planned.
- Midweek Advent in the evening no one came (but we had attendees during the noon service), so this will help formulate the upcoming Lent and Easter Season schedule.
- Prayer Service once a month appears to be a hit. As we mature in our faith, prayer is needed, even more so. Please remember, we pray together as a people of faith.
- Divine Liturgy we continue to explore our LSB and vary around good settings. We are not a church of blended or contemporary worship, but historic worship that is centered on Word and Sacrament. Some may look for a "feel good" time in church, but when you understand God is present in His Word, and in the Eucharist, "is that not the greatest feel good a Christian could have?"
- Bible Study seems to be adding a few new souls. This is an important aspect of maturing in the faith. Please note, the Bible Studies can be joined at anytime, so "dive in".
- Are we getting the information out? Well, the Web Site and FB page are always up to date. We have a monthly newsletter (emailed and printed), and the bulletin is always chock full of "what is coming up". Hint the bulletin is also on the web site, as is the newsletter. Not sure what more we can do?
- With above said We will attempt to print Pastor / Deacon meeting notes that are not of a private nature, and also some Council notes. In 2019, we will try hard to meet more and provide feedback.

These are some thoughts, and more to come in the next letter. A final thought on why no permanent office hours? Well, this is a sign of the times; a pastor should not be alone in an office meeting people.
