Paralegals are expected to follow legal ethics similar to what lawyers follow, including confidentiality, professionalism, competency, and honesty. An example of legal ethics for paralegals are:

- Paralegals cannot engage in, encourage, or contribute to any act that could be considered the unauthorized practice of law. This would include making attorney-client relationships, setting fees, giving legal advice, or representing a client in court without authorization from your attorney.
- Paralegals must maintain client confidentiality including not speaking about the client or the case with anyone outside of the office. Even chatting with your attorney at a lunch can cause problems if people around you can hear what you are saying.





Ethics vs Morals: Is there a difference?

Ethics and morals are both used in the plural and are often regarded as synonyms, but there is some distinction in how they are used.

Morals often describes one's particular values concerning what is right and what is wrong.

While ethics can refer broadly to moral principles, one often sees it applied to questions of correct behavior within a relatively narrow area of activity.

In addition, morals usually connotes an element of subjective preference, while ethics tends to suggest aspects of universal fairness and the question of whether or not an action is responsible.

5 Activities for Professional Development



Here are 5 ideas for professional development activities that you can use yourself or suggest to your boss, managing partner or human resources department for the benefit of all:


1. Visual Thinking Workshops

Visual thinking is a cognitive process that uses elements, like images and diagrams, to help you think, communicate, and problem solve. You may have heard of some of them:

 Mind Maps are diagrams to visually organize information branching out from a central concept or viewpoint.
 Xmind—Mind Map & Brainstorm



 Peel the Fruit can be used as a way to organize and map out deep understanding of a complex issue by going from the surface, flesh, and to the core. <u>Developed by Project Zero at</u> <u>Harvard University.</u>



 Six Thinking Hats assists participants by looking at things from a number of different points of view (hats) and exploring a range of perspectives.



2. The Power of Storytelling

Facts are good, but stories are more memorable. This makes storytelling an excellent skill to hone if you want to improve your influence and ability to share information. Storytelling allows you to add an emotional element to anything you share. Organizations like teambuilding.com offer storytelling masterclasses, or you can look for other storytelling experts to facilitate a workshop.

3. Communication Workshops

Communication is everyone's bread and butter. Clear and persuasive communication skills are key in leadership roles, teamwork, and demonstrating competence, which are vital for career progression.

From writing grammatically correct emails to giving the perfect elevator pitch, a communication workshop can elevate how your colleagues connect and collaborate. There are also a lot of communication games and activities that you and/or your team could try.



4. Conflict Resolution Training

Anyone serious about stepping forward in their conflict should master the art of you resolution. know how deal with challenges and navigate the tricky trail personalities, you will be valuable asset to your firm or organization.

There are several conflict resolution activities like <u>Rotate Debates or AITA</u> that can help your team members understand how to work through conflict.



5. Feedback Workshop

Giving feedback is a tricky business. While positive feedback is a great way to motivate people to do even better, negative feedback could lower morale. The bad news is negative feedback is critical for improvement. That's why it's crucial to teach team members how to give it. From the SBI model to the STAR feedback model, there are many ways to drive the right message across while taking care of team morale.

Chapter &

NALS Code of Ethics & Professional Responsibility

Members of NALS are bound by the objectives of this association and the standards of conduct required of the legal profession. Every member shall:

- Encourage respect for the law and administration of justice
- Observe rules governing privileged communications and confidential information
- Promote and exemplify high standards of loyalty, cooperation, and courtesy
- Perform all duties of the profession with integrity and competence
- Pursue a high order of professional attainment

Integrity and high standards of conduct are fundamental to the success of our professional association. This Code is promulgated by NALS and accepted by its members to accomplish these ends.

Canon I. Members of this association shall maintain a high degree of competency and integrity through continuing education to better assist the legal profession in fulfilling its duty to provide quality legal services to the public.

Canon 2. Members of this association shall maintain a high standard of ethical conduct and shall contribute to the integrity of the association and the legal profession.

Canon 3. Members of this association shall avoid a conflict of interest pertaining to a client matter.

Canon 4. Members of this association shall preserve and protect the confidences and privileged communications of a client.

Canon 5. Members of this association shall exercise care in using independent professional judgment and in determining the extent to which a client may be assisted without the presence of a lawyer and shall not act in matters involving professional legal judgment.

Canon 6. Members of this association shall not solicit legal business on behalf of a lawyer.

Canon 7. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform legal functions except under the direct

supervision of a lawyer and shall not advertise or contract with members of the general public for the performance of paralegal functions.

Canon 8. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform any of the duties restricted to lawyers or do things which lawyers themselves may not do and shall assist in preventing the unauthorized practice of law.

Canon 9. Members of this association not licensed to practice law shall not engage in the practice of law as defined by statutes or court decisions.

Canon 10. Members of this association shall do all other things incidental, necessary, or expedient to enhance professional responsibility and participation in the administration of justice and public service in cooperation with the legal profession.
