Gender Bias in the Courts

Beginning in the 1980s, many state court systems established task forces to investigate the existence of gender bias in the courts. The reports of these task forces have documented sex discrimination, with its victims more often women than men. The task forces have found that much gender bias behavior is unconscious and that the manifestation of bias, although often subtle, are deeply ingrained in state judicial systems. For example, the studies have noted the existence of stereotypes concerning victims of domestic violence and sexual assault; many judges believe that women who are beaten by a spouse or raped have provoked the attack.


These studies also have shown that judges do not always treat men and women equally in the courtroom. For example, judges may identify women appearing before them by their first name but use professional titles or "Mister" when addressing men. In response to these findings, states have set up judicial educational programs on the dangers of gender-based stereotypes and have modified judges' and lawyers' codes of conduct to explicitly prohibit gender biased behavior. These task forces have also recommended that more women be appointed to the bench.



Sudoku is **played** on a grid of 9 x 9 spaces. Within the rows and columns are 9 "squares" (made up of 3 x 3 spaces).

Each row, column and square (9 spaces each) needs to be filled out with the numbers 1-9, without repeating any numbers within the row, column or square.

The Sudoku grid comes with a few spaces already filled in; the more spaces filled in, the easier the game – the more difficult Sudoku puzzles have very few spaces that are already filled in.

Writing! How you say it matters.

Chances are you spend the a good portion of your day writing emails to your attorney, staff, clients, vendors. You can improve those communications by following these tips:

Strengthen your writing by eliminating weak words:

Just — Unless you're Nike and have built a multi-million dollar ad campaign around the words "Just Do It," eliminate "just" in most instances:

It's just my opinion. It's my opinion.

The second sentence is stronger and more succinct.

Very — This is a tough word to avoid because we were taught it should be used to convey emphasis. However, it is better to replace "very" with a more descriptive word.

It's <u>very</u> cold. *It's frigid.*

Some — too vague. "Some" should be used when writing about unknown amounts.

She moved <u>some</u> boxes to the library. She moved two boxes to the library.

If you are unsure of the exact amount, communicate generalized but perspectivebuilding details to the reader such as "a handful of," or "an armful of." **Actually** — rarely does this word add strength to what you are saying.

<u>Actually</u>, you'd be better off without him. **You'd be better off without him.**

Waffle (noun)

: empty or pretentious words

Other weak (waffle) words that too often populate our communications:

That/Well/So — if you can eliminate these words without changing the meaning of the sentence, do so.

I think/I believe/I feel/I guess/I suggest — They often don't add anything to sentences. Certain phrases, such as "I feel," can work for a psychological effect, to connect with people emotionally. But, without these phrases, your sentences can pack more punch.

I <u>think</u> we should hire an accountant to file our tax return.

By eliminating unnecessary words, you'll make your writing more precise and ultimately more effective.

NALS Code of Ethics & Professional Responsibility

Members of NALS are bound by the objectives of this association and the standards of conduct required of the legal profession. Every member shall:

- Encourage respect for the law and administration of justice
- Observe rules governing privileged communications and confidential information
- Promote and exemplify high standards of loyalty, cooperation, and courtesy
- Perform all duties of the profession with integrity and competence
- Pursue a high order of professional attainment

Integrity and high standards of conduct are fundamental to the success of our professional association. This Code is promulgated by NALS and accepted by its members to accomplish these ends.

Canon 1. Members of this association shall maintain a high degree of competency and integrity through continuing education to better assist the legal profession in fulfilling its duty to provide quality legal services to the public.
Canon 2. Members of this association shall maintain a high standard of ethical conduct and shall contribute to the integrity of the association and the legal profession.
Canon 3. Members of this association shall avoid a conflict of interest pertaining to a client matter.

Canon 4. Members of this association shall preserve and protect the confidences and privileged communications of a client.

Canon 5. Members of this association shall exercise care in using independent professional judgment and in determining the extent to which a client may be assisted without the presence of a lawyer and shall not act in matters involving professional legal judgment.

Canon 6. Members of this association shall not solicit legal business on behalf of a lawyer.

Canon 7. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform legal functions except under the direct supervision of a lawyer and shall not advertise or contract with members of the general public for the performance of paralegal functions.

Canon 8. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform any of the duties restricted to lawyers or do things which lawyers themselves may not do and shall assist in preventing the unauthorized practice of law.

Canon 9. Members of this association not licensed to practice law shall not engage in the practice of law as defined by statutes or court decisions.

Canon 10. Members of this association shall do all other things incidental, necessary, or expedient to enhance

professional responsibility and participation in the administration of justice and public service in cooperation with the legal profession.
