
The Art of Online Research

Ann Walsh Long is new to Nevada but has more than 30 years of experience working as a law librarian. Ann literally wrote the book on Advanced Legal Research (for West Academic), primarily to help her students learn the indispensable legal research resources for each stage of civil litigation.

Prior to joining the court in July, Ann was a founding librarian and an Associate Professor of Law at Lincoln Memorial University's Duncan School of Law where she taught Legal Research I, II, and III, Advanced Legal Research and Advanced Legal Research for Competitive Intelligence.

Ann has been recognized twice by the American Association of Law Libraries – first for writing the article of the year for the association's *Spectrum* magazine and later for her work as Chair on the Publishing Initiatives Caucus, she received a Presidential Certificate of Merit.

Additionally, Ann worked in the law libraries of four "Big Law" firms and at the Environmental Protectional Agency's Library in Washington, D.C.




Who Cares?

Why Research is an Important Skill to Have

Builds Knowledge Base

The most prominent reason to engage in research is to enhance your knowledge. Even if you are an expert in your field, there is always more to uncover. If researching about a topic entirely new to you, your skills will help build your unique perspective about it. The whole process of research opens new doors of learning and fosters subject matter growth.

Enables Efficient Learning

Studies reveal that research helps restore and protect memory and enhances mathematic and problem-solving skills. Therefore, it prepares the mind for a better understanding of concepts and theories. As a person's learning capacity improves they are able to perform better than someone who is reluctant to research.

Aids Employment Prospects

Research has an undeniable role in the legal industry. Successful firms have invested heavily in electronic research tools. Your skills in knowing how to use them will prepare you for any tasks you will need to accomplish in the future.

Helps in Understanding Issues

The ability to "go deep" into a topic may shed light on problems that have not yet come out in the open and will give you the opportunity to assist your attorney by pointing out issues and questions that may not have been considered.

Provides Truthful Evidence

The process of research can prove to dispel various myths that have been built up in our minds. They can either develop because of a common belief or a wrong resource. Logical and fact-based knowledge is easily accessible if you only reach out to find the truth.

Develops a Love of Reading and Analyzing

Reading and writing are the core elements of research. Reading helps open your mind to a never-ending horizon of knowledge. Developing writing skills gives you the ability to express yourself in a constructive way.

Exercises your Mind

Letting your mind frequently absorb logic and creativity allows it to become more active. It creates a healthy curiosity that fuels the brain and makes it seek new answers.

Keeps You Updated on Recent Information

In various fields there are always new discoveries to explore. Research prevents you from remaining behind or have inaccurate information about a topic. You can use the latest knowledge to build upon ideas or talk confidently about a subject if required. Which takes us to the next factor about building credibility.

Builds Credibility

People tend to take a person's ideas seriously when it evident he or she is well informed about them. Being involved in research helps in forming a solid foundation upon which to build an opinion. It also makes it much harder for people to find fault in something you have proposed.

Focuses your Scope

If you are delving into a topic for the first time, it might be confusing to know where to begin. Most of the time you have an overwhelming amount of information to sort through. Research helps in narrowing down the topic to the most important and unique points so you are able to write meaningfully.

Teaches Discernment

When you become adept at research you can easily identify between low- and high-quality data. You will get better at discerning accurate from false information. Any gray areas will also become clear where the facts are correct but conclusions might be questionable.

Introduces New Ideas

It is possible that you already have preconceived ideas and opinions about a topic are asked to research which may or may not be correct. Skillful research can unearth different or additional facts that will encourage you to review your own perspective, entertain fresh ideas, and perhaps change your mind about a concept or two.

Encourages Curiosity

A love for learning new things can last a lifetime if you have sources to fuel it. Even the most basic research opens up new possibilities and develops analytical skills. When you have committed yourself to gaining knowledge, it constantly helps you to grow.

Prepares you For the Future



NALS Code of Ethics & Professional Responsibility

Members of NALS are bound by the objectives of this association and the standards of conduct required of the legal profession. Every member shall:

- Encourage respect for the law and administration of justice
- Observe rules governing privileged communications and confidential information
- Promote and exemplify high standards of loyalty, cooperation, and courtesy
- Perform all duties of the profession with integrity and competence
- Pursue a high order of professional attainment

Integrity and high standards of conduct are fundamental to the success of our professional association. This Code is promulgated by NALS and accepted by its members to accomplish these ends.

Canon 1. Members of this association shall maintain a high degree of competency and integrity through continuing education to better assist the legal profession in fulfilling its duty to provide quality legal services to the public.

Canon 2. Members of this association shall maintain a high standard of ethical conduct and shall contribute to the integrity of the association and the legal profession.

Canon 3. Members of this association shall avoid a conflict of interest pertaining to a client matter.

Canon 4. Members of this association shall preserve and protect the confidences and privileged communications of a client. **Canon 5.** Members of this association shall exercise care in

using independent professional judgment and in determining the extent to which a client may be assisted without the presence of a lawyer and shall not act in matters involving professional legal judgment.

Canon 6. Members of this association shall not solicit legal business on behalf of a lawyer.

Canon 7. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform legal functions except under the direct supervision of a lawyer and shall not advertise or contract with members of the general public for the performance of paralegal functions.

Canon 8. Members of this association, unless permitted by law, shall not perform any of the duties restricted to lawyers or do things which lawyers themselves may not do and shall assist in preventing the unauthorized practice of law.

Canon 9. Members of this association not licensed to practice law shall not engage in the practice of law as defined by statutes or court decisions.

Canon 10. Members of this association shall do all other things incidental, necessary, or expedient to enhance professional responsibility and participation in the administration of justice and public service in cooperation with the legal profession.
